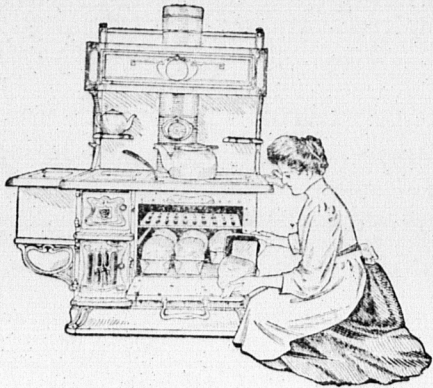

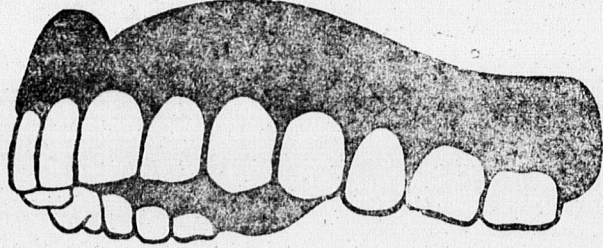

The recent social and entertainment at Nail Pond was most enjoyable, about sixty two dollars being realized.

Judgment was given at the Police Court at Summerside, yesterday, in the adjourned prosecution case of John Ivy. The defendant was fined \$100, and costs.

The funeral of the late R. McStavert, took place from his late residence General St., Summerside, yesterday afternoon, to the People's Cemetery and was very largely attended. The services at the house were conducted by the Rev. Hammond Johnson, and the Masonic services at the grave were conducted by W. K. McGougan, W. M., and W. T. Burrows, W. Chap. The pall-bearers were Wm. Stewart, Thomas E. Ramsay, W. H. Manson, J. S. Allen, J. D. Enman and Murdoch McLeod.

A largely attended meeting of the Summerside board of trade was held in the Council chamber last night, with the President in the chair. The report of the different committees regarding the all night telephone system Summerside, proposed changes in the post office. The reports of the island's board of trade were received and after considerable discussion adopted. A committee was appointed to impress upon the Telephone Company the urgent need of all night telephone system and also of installing fire alarm system in connection with the telephone service. The names of five new members were read, and the same were elected to membership. Considerable discussion then took place regarding the steamboat service between Summerside and St. John's, Newfoundland, and after a committee had been appointed to take up the matter with the department of trade and commerce the meeting adjourned.
