Yesterday the Northumberland arrived at Pictou from Charlottetown at 12.00 a. m. She left again about 5.10 p. m. with passengers, express, mail and freight and arrived at 9.10 p. m. She leaves today at 8.20 for Pictou returning at night.

Yesterday Charlottetown people were given a taste of the coming cold season in a terrific gale and snow fall. Several cases were tried yesterday before Stipendiary Shaw, Charlottetown, against parties for improper conduct on the Murray Harbor train. Charges were preferred against Alex. The defendant appeared and confessed and was ordered to pay the sum of twenty-five dollars fine and costs and in default to be imprisoned for twenty days in the Queen's County jail.
