Stocks Begin New Year On Downward Trend

NEW YORK, Jan. 3.—(AP)—Selling pressure concentrated in one brief interval today set the stock market back by fractions to more than two points with some losses going beyond 3. Trading volume stepped up sharply on the break with more than a third of the day's transactions of 980,000 shares being made in the hour before noon. Both before and after the sharp slide, the market was quiet and prices moved narrowly. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 1.1 points, equaling its widest fall since Nov. 9. It stood at 63.4 the lowest point since Nov. 30. The industrial component of the average dropped 1.4 points, rails were off .9 of a point, and utilities were down only .3 of a point. The declines were spread throughout every major group in the list, but the rails, steels and motors were among those under the greatest pressure. Some shares stood against the trend. Among these were American Broadcasting Co., up 3.1-8 to a new 1948-49 high of 10 1-2. Packard Motor Car, up 1-8 and Gaylord Container, up 1-4 to 21 7-8. Some of the widest losers were Nickel Pipe off 3-4, Union Pacific off 2-1-2, Kennecott Copper off 2, American Smelting off 2, Du Pont off 3-1-2, Allied Chemical off 2 1-2, Magnavox 1-5-8, Skelly Oil off 2-1-2, Superior Oil of California off 10 at 1 1/2.
