BARON CHARNWOOD APPROVES LETTER OF LORD GREY

LONDON, Feb. 11.—Baron Charnwood, seconding the address of thanks in the house of lords for the king's speech, expressed approval of the recent letter of Viscount Grey, British ambassador at Washington, with regard to the American position on the peace treaty.

"I consider that the letter did not favor of interference in the domestic affairs of the United States and I feel no sentiment, but thanks to Lord Grey," he declared.

"If Germany shows a disposition faithfully to carry out her obligations," he added, "we will do our best to aid her in fulfilling them and resuming her place among civilized communities."

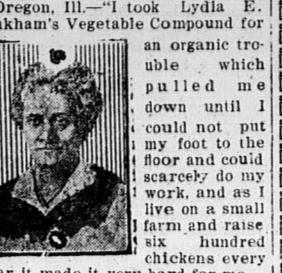

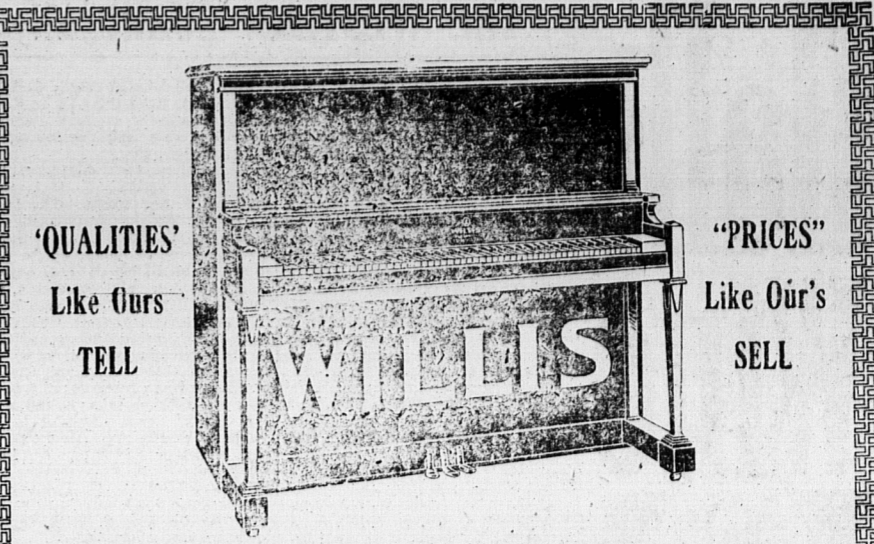
