**LICENSES.**—Motor cyclists, of whom there are not as yet more than a few in this province, will this year have to be registered and pay licenses, this class of cycles having been brought by the Government into line with other motor vehicles. Of course, the license fee for motor cycles has not been made as high as for motor cars, and is being exacted on a different basis also. For each motor car a registration fee of \$5 has to be paid, and in addition an annual license, the rate of which is fixed according to the nominal horsepower of the car—the more powerful the car the greater the license. The license on motor cycles is not exacted on this sliding scale, but has been put at a flat rate. Besides a registration fee of \$2, for each motor cycle, a fixed annual license of \$3 has to be paid. In consequence of the introduction of this tax upon motor cycles, prosecutions to recover the license have recently been brought in the Magistrate's Court.
