## SPORT NOTES

### Wrestling

The wrestling bout staged at the Arena Rink last Friday night is still one of the chief topics of conversation throughout the city and many parts of the province. When it was announced that Zybsko had "run" out of his match with Patterson, Canadian champion, many in the audience felt more or less disappointed, however, the substitute, Bob McWilliams, one of the cleverest of his weight in the world, gave the fans all and perhaps more than Zybsko could have done, by way of fast, scientific and aggressive wrestling.

Friday night's match is history now, Patterson lost in two straight falls after a hectic battle in which the fans were kept on their toes throughout. Zybsko was forgotten in the great match which was being unfolded before their eyes.

In a previous encounter between Patterson and McWilliams in Saint John, the former defeated the Moncton man in straight falls. It was a championship match and McWilliams ever since has been trying to corner the Dominion champion for a return bout.

It has been learned by the writer that Patterson, due to his defeat in Friday's set-to, has consented to a return bout with his title at stake. Toronto interests hearing of the forthcoming match have wired Patterson asking if he would not defend his title in that City. The Queen City quick to grasp anything of a championship calibre has offered some tempting inducements. However, a number of prominent men of this city got together and have succeeded in securing the match for Charlottetown. The match will take place at the Arena on September 28th. Patterson started training yesterday for the defence of his title.

With reference to the preliminary bouts which were to have taken place, the management were as much disappointed as the fans. McDonald of Montreal was in the city and ready, but Smith, who in company with Zybsko left for Jacksonville, was in Northern New Brunswick and nothing has been heard from them since.

The promoters of the coming event benefiting from Friday night's experience intend to contract all their preliminaries which will insure their presence on the night of the bouts. It is learned that some of the fastest and cleverest boxers in the Maritime Provinces will be the preliminary attraction to the big wrestling match.

### Boxing

The Prince Edward Island Amateur Boxing Championships which take place in Montague this evening have attracted province-wide attention. The bouts of three rounds duration are governed under the Maritime Province Branch of the Amateur Athletic Union rules.

Much interest has been taken in baseball, field and track, football hockey and many other lines of sport endeavor in this province, so much so, that boxing, one of the greatest sports there is, not only from a recreative point of view but physically and mentally as well, has been more or less neglected. Therefore the Championships this year will be a distinct advance in a new sport which is popular in every other city and province in Canada.

Later in the season the Island championships will again be held in Charlottetown, the champions of this series will then defend their titles in an inter city championship series; the winners will then be qualified to box off for the various maritime titles which takes place some time this winter either in Saint John or Halifax.

In all the history of boxing in the Maritimes there has never been a representative from the Island as coming from an Island Club, Prince Edward Island athletes have excelled year after year in other branches of sport, therefore there is no reason why we should not command a prominent place in the Maritime boxing firmament as well. The championships should be a yearly event in order to make boxing a success on the Island. The Clubs and those in charge are to be highly congratulated in the arrangements of this year's event.

Reports from Tignish where it is understood that a string of boxers intend to participate, say that the boys are in the best of shape and are confident of bringing some of the laurels back to the far western centre. From personal observation the local performers of the squared circle are in top form and will give the best that's in them.

### Several Forms

J. R. Asks—How many styles of wrestling are there?

Answer: Catch-as-Catch Can, Greco-Roman, Lancashire, Cumberland and Westmoreland, Cornwell and Devon, and Jujutsu or Japanese style.

The various style of wrestling differ in the definition of a fall and in the governing rules. In Greco-Roman wrestling, tripping and taking hold of the legs are forbidden, and a fall is gained, if one fall is necessary (that is the bout is won) by the contestant who pins his opponent's shoulders to the mat for a duration of three seconds. In catch-as-catch-can wrestling, all holds are permitted as such as may be barred by mutual consent, and a fall is defined as in Greco-Roman style. Lancashire and Westmoreland wrestling the contestants stand chest to chest, grasping each other around the body. The one first loosing his hold, or touching the ground with any part of his body except his feet, loses the bout. If both fall to the ground at the same time it is a "dogfall" and must be wrestled over. In the Cornwell and Devon wrestling, the wrestlers compete in strong loose linen jackets, catching hold of the jacket or any


