After general discussion in which many took part a resolution was unanimously adopted submitting reasons why the translation of the pastor at this juncture would be inopportune and a delegation of twelve representing the various departments of church work was appointed to attend a meeting of the Presbytery which is being held in Charlottetown today and present the resolution. On motion the meeting was constituted a delegation to wait upon Mr. Strathe and urge upon him the desirability of continuing his present pastorate. Accordingly about 30 or 40 invaded the manse at nine thirty p. m. that evening and represented as forcibly as possible the unanimous desire of the congregation. Mr. Strathe expressed very feelingly his appreciation of the confidence shown in his ministry and promised to give this matter his most earnest consideration.

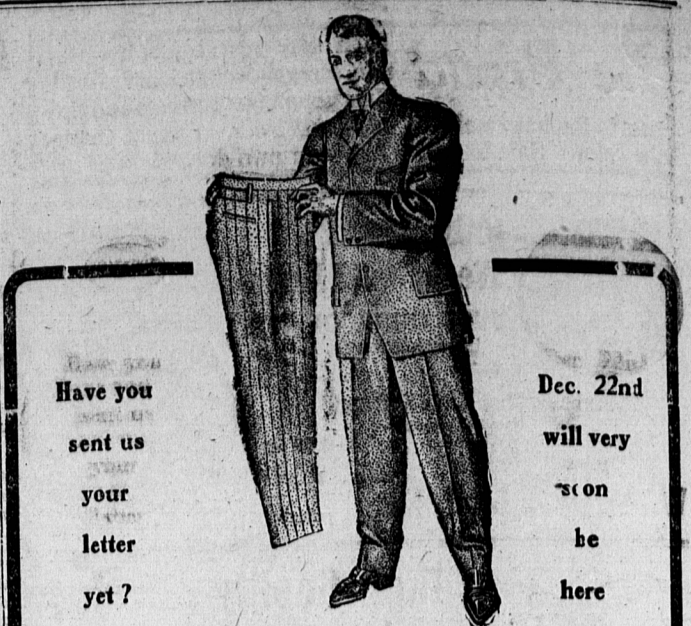

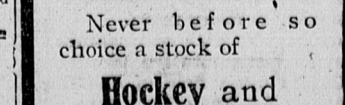
