

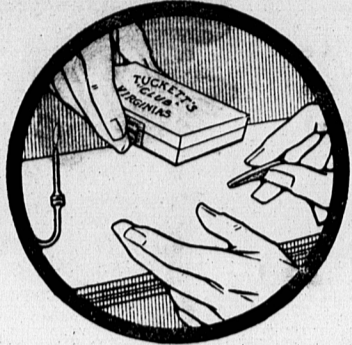

## PARTY TACTICS IN ELECTION.

(Continued from page 1.)

This is the fourth challenge, which is as yet unaccepted by the Radicals. The others are, firstly, a challenge to send a joint free trade and tariff reform deputation to Germany to see whether German work people are down-trodden under tariffs and compelled to eat dog flesh and offal.

Secondly, a challenge to send an impartial deputation to Canada to judge whether Canada is abandoning the tariff.

Thirdly, a challenge to show whence the free-trade organizations get their funds.

Lord Ridley, chairman of the Tariff Reform League, answering the challenge issued by the National Reform Union, offered to submit the league's bank pass-books to any firm of auditors and permit publication of all subscriptions received, if free trade organizations do the same. He also promised to pay £1,000 to any charity if one single subscription is found from a non-British subject. Lord Ridley says: "Tariff reformers suspect enormous funds at the disposal of the Free Trade Union and other kindred organizations are received very largely from subscriptions from foreign gentlemen, middlemen and certain manufacturers, whose interests lie in supporting free trade in other countries. No doubt the publication would finally set these suspicions at rest, but the records of the budget league having been burnt, I am quite willing to omit that organization."

Lord Weardale, chairman of the National Reform Union, declines the challenge on the ground that he is not concerned with other free trade organizations, whose subscription lists have, he believes, been regularly published.

The net effect of the incident is to discount greatly the supposed mystery of the tariff reform funds. Bonar Law's assertion is that the subscriptions for the whole seven years' existence of the league do not exceed the amount Cobden's anti-corn law league received in one year.
