Rev. J. S. Mullins is Suspended

"GOOD-BYE MODERATOR"

You Can Give Me the Certificate or You Can Keep It."

St. JOHN, July 4.—The St. John Presbytery to-day elected Rev. J. S. Sutherland, Sussex, moderator, and Rev. James Ross, clerk.

In answer to citation Rev. J. S. Mullin appeared before the Presbytery Stanley, in answer to a charge of preaching in defiance of the prohibition of Presbytery. Mr. Mullin's defence was that he preached, not as a member of St. John Presbytery, but as a member of the Church of Scotland. He stated that he had severed his connection with the Presbyterian church in Canada; also that the church at Stanley had been decided as "St. Paul's church, Stanley, Church of Scotland," and the congregation had asked him to preach. Mr. Mullin said he had applied to the clerk for his certificate to preach, but had not received it. In closing his address he started to leave, but turned and said: "You can give me the certificate or you can keep it. I am done with you. I will never appear before you again. Good bye, Mr. Moderator, Good bye, gentlemen."

Judge Forbes asked him why he did not admit having preached as stated in the citation.

Mr. Mullin said that he did admit it.

Judge Forbes then moved, seconded by Rev. A. S. Morison, that "J. S. Mullin be suspended as a minister and as a member of the church until he shows signs of repentance."

The resolution was carried unanimously.

Laurier Gov't Regarding Yukon

JUDGE DUGAS' DEFENCE

Conservative Senators Hold Caucus on the Grand Trunk Agreement.

OTTAWA, July 5.—(Special)—The Conservative Senators discussed the Grand Trunk agreement in caucus for two hours today.

They are opposed to the bill but did not decide on any definite course of action.

MONTREAL, July 5.—(Special)—Judge Dugas, in a letter says he has openly purchased a few gold claims but denies that he has made any large profits.

He thinks with proper regulations and cheaper food and labor the Yukon would be a good country to live in.

The London Times criticises the Government's attitude in regard to the Yukon charges, its article concluding as follows:

"We do not say that the charges are true, still less that any of the individuals named by Sir Hibbert are guilty; but it certainly seems regrettable that a matter so serious should have been treated by the Laurier government as a strictly party question."

"The Minister of the Interior fell back on Mr. Ogilvie's report, which is still incomplete, and said that it was the duty of the cabinet not to resign the political responsibility to a commission of judges."

"There is, perhaps something to be said for this position from a purely constitutional standpoint, but the government would have been better advised had they shown a deeper sense of the serious character of the charges and the necessity of meeting it."

The Prince Arthur a Flyer.

The Boston Advertiser says: At the invitation of the management of the Dominion Atlantic railway, nearly 200 guests enjoyed a trip in the new steel steamship Prince Arthur on Saturday afternoon.

The steamer, in charge of Captain Kinney, cruised below Boston light and about the lightship six miles beyond and along the north shore. When the Plant liner La Grande Duchesse came out into the bay, on her way to Halifax, the Prince Arthur was hoisted and later both vessels engaged in an exciting ocean race for about five miles.

The vessels were set ahead at full speed, but the Prince Arthur proved the faster, and tantalizing crossed the bows of La Grande Duchesse with a salute of three whistles, which Captain Hanlon of the latter steamer, gracefully answered. The Prince Arthur was making over 20 knots in her burst of speed, and is no doubt the fastest vessel sailing out of our harbor.

La Grande Duchesse, it may be mentioned was not in racing trim.

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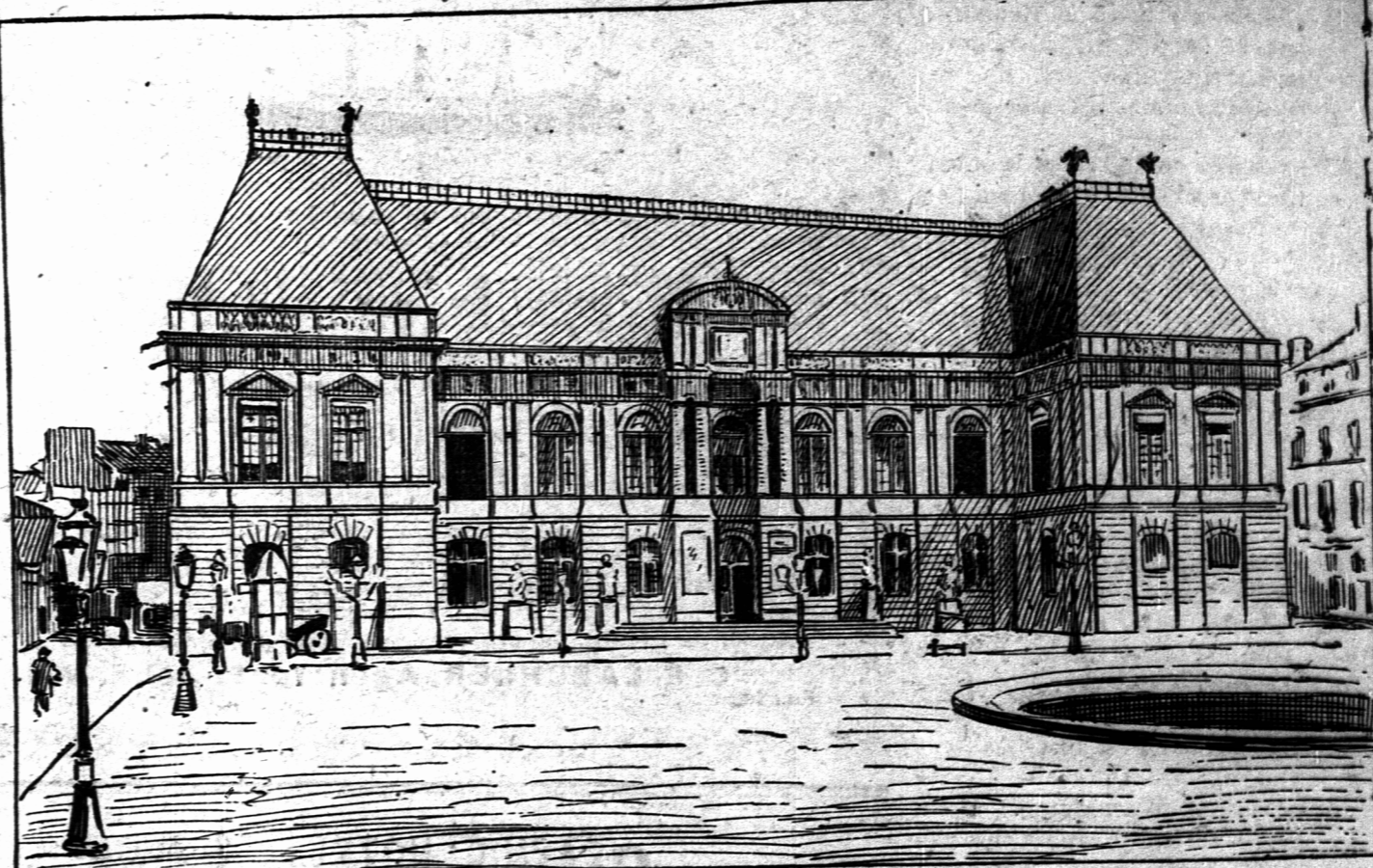

THE PALAIS DE JUSTICE AT RENNES.

WHERE CAPTAIN ALFRED DREYFUS WILL BE RETRIED.—St. James Budget.

The new court-martial upon Captain Alfred Dreyfus, from which all lovers of justice and truth trust him to emerge triumphant, is to be held in the town of Rennes, the capital of the department of Ille et Vilaine. Rennes, which has a population of 69,200, possesses a university, academy, museum, and a library of 50,000 volumes. It was besieged by the English in 1356, the siege being raised by Du Garselle. At this place was established by Henry II, of France, the parliament so celebrated for its independence, especially in its struggle with the Court, 1788-89. The other public buildings of Rennes besides the Palais de Justice, are the cathedral, a large but inelegant specimen of early Gothic; St. Peter's Church, with its two grand old towers; and the town hall. Rennes is divided into the upper or new town, and the lower or old town. It is surrounded by ancient walls, flanked with towers, beyond which lie extensive suburbs. It is an important railway centre and is the seat of a number of thriving industries.

ONTARIO MARTIN PREMIER SEMLIN

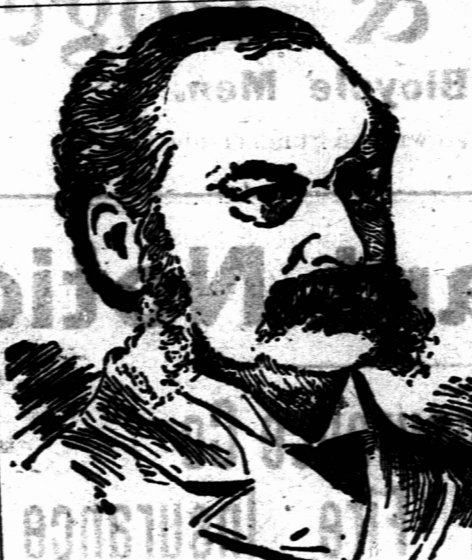
Will Retire to Accept a Big Row in British Columbia Cabinet.

ROSS WILL SUCCEED MARTIN'S RESIGNATION

Prohibitionist and Platform Demanded But Refused—Orator—Now Minister of Education. Will Lead to a General Election.

TORONTO, July 5.—(Special).—Hon. A. S. Hardy will likely resign the Premiership shortly to be succeeded by Hon. Geo. W. Ross.

Premier Hardy has been a member of the government of Ontario since 1877. He succeeded to the leadership on the retirement of Sir Oliver Mowatt in July 1896.

Hon. G. W. Ross was a good while in the Commons, but resigned and became Minister of Education in the Ontario Government in 1888. He is a well-known prohibitionist and is regarded by many as the best platform speaker in Canada.

Hon. Mr. Hardy will be appointed to a judgeship, it is said, though he has passed the age limit for receiving a judicial appointment.

MARTIN SEMLIN

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ROSS WILL SUCCEED MARTIN'S RESIGNATION

Prohibitionist and Platform Demanded But Refused—Orator—Now Minister of Education. Will Lead to a General Election.

VANCOUVER, July 5.—(Special).—Premier Semlin has demanded Hon. Joe Martin's resignation as Attorney General and it has been refused.

Premier Semlin charges Martin with conduct unbecoming a minister of the Crown at a public banquet, with telling state secrets and neglect of official duty as Attorney General.

An appeal to the people is likely to result from the crisis.

Martin has the support of the Socialist and Organized Labor parties.

Semlin is a Conservative and Martin a Liberal. Federal politics have tended to divide the coalition. Martin enjoys the distinction of having been Attorney General at different times in Manitoba and British Columbia, and is a vigorous fighter.
