MUNICIPAL OWNERSHIP.

The Canadian Magazine in its October issue called the "progress number" deals with various features of our national advancement and among other branches of the subject touches the growth of municipal ownership.

Canadian railways in 1896 carried a little over 24 millions tons of freight and in 1903 they carried 47,373,417 tons, or almost 100 per cent more.

Manitoba contributes yearly for the support of education \$1,809,276, or at the rate of \$5.22 per head. No other Province can approach this record.

Canada's 46 electric railways last year carried 167,000,000 passengers, a number equal to 28 times the entire population of the Dominion. The gross revenue was \$7,777,000. The average price paid for each ride was about four cents.

John O'Brien was convicted last winter for a first offence against the Prohibitory Law, fined \$100 and afterward sent to jail. He was subsequently released on a plea of illness and a promise to stop selling but as usual in these cases, made a rapid recovery and also as usual, began selling again.

We remarked during the progress of the Exhibition the general sobriety which characterised the gathering. As is known, the attendance during several days was almost unprecedented. Our city was full of people, and never before was such a standard of good order and sobriety maintained on a like occasion.
