### THE GROWING OF CLOVER.

There is no way by which the farmer can keep up the fertility of his soil that surpasses the growing of clover. The difficulty, however, is to get the clover to grow. Experience has shown that it is almost useless to try to grow it on poor land or land deficient in humus, or in lime, but even when these conditions are favorable it sometimes happens that a good stand of clover is not obtained because the bacteria which enable the clover plant to take its nitrogen from the air are not present in the soil. Some years ago the inoculating of clover seed with bacteria was tried at the Ontario Agricultural College and the result proved very profitable, and at the present time cultures are being grown and sent out to Nova Scotia. College of Agriculture has also taken up this work, and every year thousands of cultures are prepared and distributed. Full directions are sent out with them and there is no difficulty whatever in applying them. To cover the cost of putting up them, mailing 25c. is charged for each culture. Any farmers who are planning to use the culture this year should send for it at once either to Prin. Cumming, College of Agriculture, Truro, N. S. or to Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, Ont., and state the kind of clover which he plans to use it as near as possible the date on which he is likely to sow the clover. Fresh made culture is better than culture that has been made up for some time.
