## Victims of the Maine.

HAVANA, Dec. 20, 1899.—The battle-  
ship Texas, Capt. Sigbee commanding,  
arrived here Monday, and Capt. Greene,  
commandant of the naval station, con-  
ferred with Capt. Sigbee in regard to  
the removal from Colon cemetery of the  
bodies of the victims of the destruc-

tion of the Maine. The present inten-  
tion is to remove the remains with as  
little ceremony as possible. The work  
of disinterment will begin tomorrow  
morning, and each coffin will be in-  
closed in a metal casket and surround-  
ed by a disinfecting compound.

The casket will be removed during  
the night to the naval wharf, where  
they will be under guard until all is  
ready for removal to the battleships,  
which, it is expected will take place  
Wednesday night or Thursday at day-  
break. The Texas will then leave at  
once.

Fr. Chidwick will identify the coffins  
as they are taken from the ground,  
having a chart showing the exact loca-  
tion of each.
