At the three-quarter station of the third mile John McGregor was several lengths in the lead, and with two heats under his belt it looked as if he was billed for first money. At the three-quarter pole she moved around the flied, entering the last turn she was gaining at the head of the stretch she was lapped on the leader and, on even grounds at the distance stand, she showed her nose in front at the wire while the stands shouted approval.

NEW YORK, June 27.—The Athletics split a double header with the Yankees today before 61,000 fans, Philadelphia triumphing in the opener by 4 to 2 and dropping the second by 7 to 3. Jack Quinn held the New York sluggers to six hits and struck out Lou Gehrig three times in the first game. The Yankees grouped four hits, together with a base on balls and two errors in the first inning of the closing engagement for five runs, and coasted along to an easy victory. Gehrig propelled his twenty-second home run of the season off Fate in the seventh. Moore limited the Mackmen to five hits. Babe Ruth was out of the line-up with trouble with his right knee.
