GHASTLY MURDER BROUGHT TO LIGHT

After Having been Committed Nearly Two Weeks Ago—Body Badly Decomposed and Placed in a Trunk where it was Found.

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 23.—(Special)—What appears to be a murder committed nearly two weeks ago and peculiarly ghastly in its details was discovered late this afternoon when the badly decomposed body of Mrs. John Hammond was found wedged in a trunk in the house where she lived with her husband.
