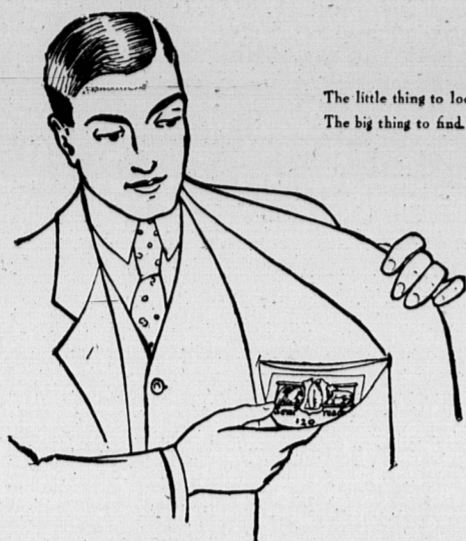

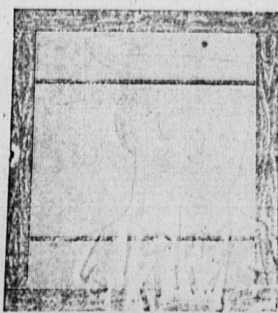

WALSH MUCH WANTED MAN.

BOSTON, June 3—Martin J. Walsh, who has been missing from his usual haunts in this city since the National City Bank of Cambridge went on to the financial rocks last February, was identified by several witnesses in the trial of Big Bill Keliher today, not only as a close friend of the burly defendant, but as the dealer in the alleged laro through which Coleman said he lost much of the bank's money.

The absence of Mr. Walsh, whose trunks have been traced out of the country, the Government today placed a dozen witnesses on the stand. Through their testimony it appeared that a real estate firm and "The Boston Bureau of the Racing Department" of an alleged telegraph company, called John R. Marshall and Company, was made up of Keliher and Walsh, and that they had offices at 6 Beacon Street and 30 Huntington Avenue, in this city.

Previously Coleman had testified that when a laro dealer called "Jack Leonard" was playing, the game was not on the scene. Coleman's most intimate friend, Young Lockhart, was then placed on the stand to identify a picture as the man who Coleman knew as Jack Leonard. Immediately after a Newton man identified the same picture as that of Martin J. Walsh, almost as well known in this city as Keliher.

Several other witnesses also identified the picture as the man who they had seen with both Keliher and Coleman, at both No. 6 Beacon Street and at 30 Huntington Avenue. Marshall and Company fitted up offices at both places, and had elaborate stationary printed.

\$9,000 IN FURS SEIZED

PORT ARTHUR, Ontario, June 2.—One of the largest seizures of furs made in Canada was effected by Provincial Constable Symonds last Friday at Montzambert, a station on the Canadian Pacific, a short distance east of White River. The consignment consisted of eighteen bales of otter, beaver and muskrat skins, valued at \$9,000. They were brought here last night in charge of the constable. The furs were in the possession of Indians.

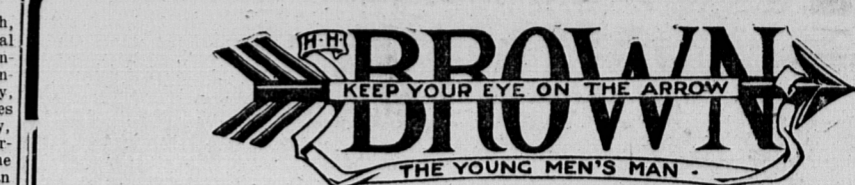

PRICES SOAR IN WINNIPEG.

WINNIPEG, June 3.—The estimated assessment of realty values of the city for 1910 is \$153,000,000, as against \$108,000,000 for the last year. A reduction in the tax rate of something like ten mills is looked for as a result, and this year is assessed at full selling value. Prices just now are higher than ever before.

QUIBEK, June 3.—The body of a man, apparently a Jewish pedlar, was discovered hanging from a rafter in the barn belonging to a farmer in Groulins Village yesterday. Who the man is or where he hailed from has not been established as yet. An inquest will be held.

NAGARA FALLS, Ont., June 3.—While connecting a new extension to an old dead wire on a pole near Montrose yesterday, John Egeler, a lineman in the employ of the Ontario Power Company, received a momentary charge of a high voltage current, and though promptly taken from the pole by his associates, his efforts made to resuscitate him, he died before medical aid could be obtained. Where the charge of electricity came from is a mystery, as the officials of the Ontario Power Co. claim all the power was turned off.

A friendly match took place at the Summerside Rifle Range on Friday afternoon last between four prominent members of the club, which resulted in a victory for the "Alderman" and the "Jeweler" over their opponents, the "Groceryman" and the Secretary of the club. The result of the match was close and in doubt until the last shot was fired. Notwithstanding that the light did not suit him and his glasses were not fitted right, the Alderman led the competition with a respectable score. One of the losing team blamed the defeat on him using a new rifle to which he was not accustomed. As a result of the match the winners as well as all the others present during the competition were treated to ice cream at the expense of the losers, who have challenged their opponents to another match some afternoon this week.
