OTTAWA, June 22 — (CP) — Prime Minister King announced tonight the appointment of R. J. M. Parker of Regina as Lieut.-Governor of Saskatchewan.

Mr. Parker, a former Municipal Affairs Minister in the Saskatchewan cabinet, succeeds Thomas Miller, publisher of the Moose Jaw Times-Herald, who died Wednesday after a four-month term as Lieutenant-Governor.

OTTAWA, June 21 — (CP) — Canadians suffering a miniature potato famine in some sections got an explanation tonight in Dominion Bureau of Statistics figures showing just what happened to the 82,348,000 bushels the Dominion produced last year.

In 1944 production was heavy — 26 per cent above the 1935-39 average — but Canada's 1944 exports of table stock was a record. During the July-April season 6,687,000 bushels of table stock potatoes left the country with the great bulk going to the United States.

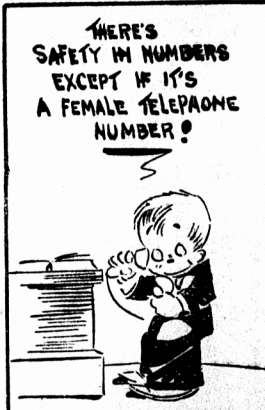

LONDON, June 22 — (AP) — Branding the Moscow trial of Polish underground leaders as a "slandereous" attempt to discredit his London Polish Government, Premier Tomaz Arciszewski declared today he was drafting an appeal to Prime Minister Churchill and President Truman, to intercede and ask the Russians to withdraw their forces from Poland.

PLYMOUTH, England — (CP) — Dr. Stanley Wells Kemp, F.R.S., the leading British authority on marine biology, has died at the age of 62. He planned and led the voyages of the research ship Discovery II.
