The Good Seed Meetings held at Montague on Feb. 2nd and 3rd inst. were a grand success. The farmers in this vicinity numbering over a hundred took part in grain judging and weed seed identification. Addresses were given on the following subjects by L. H. Newman, Secy. Canadian Seed Growers' Association and E. J. Broderick, Maritime Rep't. Can. Seed Growers' Association (1), Rotation of grain crops; (2), Fungus diseases of farm crops; (3), Relation between crop improvements and soil condition; (4), Improvement of farm crops; (5), Seed growing in the Maritime Provinces. Prizes offered by the Provincial Department of Agriculture for the greatest skill in grain judging and weed seed identification were awarded as follows:—

1st prize, Montague Annex, Montague; 2nd Cyrus Moar, Victoria Cross and 3rd to John Fraser, Montague. Several addresses were given and the farmers obtained a lot of information concerning the methods of farming by asking questions. Prof. Theodore Ross was also present and gave several lessons concerning farming on our own Island. The following resolution moved by John A. Annear and seconded by Mr. Robertson was carried unanimously: that the Department of Agriculture be asked to hold a meeting at Montague on or about the first of July next, to which the farmers may bring specimens of their troublesome weeds, have them identified and the best means of destroying them pointed out. It was moved by Murdoch McKinnon, M. P. P., Montague, and seconded by Mr. Wiggintou, Dundas, that a vote of thanks be tendered the gentlemen in charge which was heartily adopted. One of the best meetings ever held for this purpose was then brought to a close.
