Sub-Committees For Arts And Crafts Centre Appointed

On Monday evening, December 18, the general committee of the Charlottetown Arts and Crafts Centre held a meeting in the Harris Memorial Library.

Mr. H.B. Chandler, Director of Adult Education for the Province, acted as temporary chairman. A general discussion on the advisability of opening an arts and crafts centre in the city took place. It was decided that committees be selected to go into the various aspects of the undertaking. Lt.-Col. L.T. McCurdy of the National Art Gallery, Ottawa, requesting that Miss Nora McCullough's work in Prince Edward Island be extended for another six months. Mr. H.B. Chandler was asked to report to Mr. McCurdy on the success of the extension art lectures and exhibition of paintings which Miss Nora McCullough has conducted in this Province during the past three months. Mr. Chandler was asked to include a report of the enthusiasm shown in the work done at the temporary Art Centre for children in Charlottetown and the guidance of Miss McCullough, which led to a public meeting being called to discuss the establishment of such a centre here permanently.
