INCREASING CAPITAL.—The directors of the Empire Black Fox Co., Ltd., are applying to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for supplementary letters patent to increase the company's capital stock from \$50,000 to \$300,000, divided into shares of \$100 each. It is stated that this increase is for the purpose of enabling the company to add largely to the number of their breeding foxes.

PROHIBITION CASES.—There will come on for trial in the Magistrate's Court at Georgetown to-day, before His Honour Mr. Arthur McQuaid, the prohibition cases against Drs. Grant and Allan and J. D. Knight, of Curdigan, which were first before the Magistrate in February last and were recently the subject of an application in the Supreme Court for writ of prohibition and an appeal therefrom which was allowed. There are several other cases for infractions of the Prohibition Act also for trial. Rev. W. D. 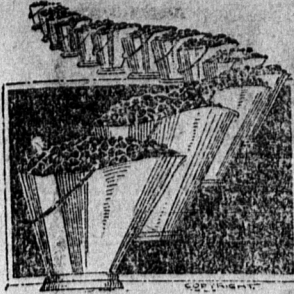

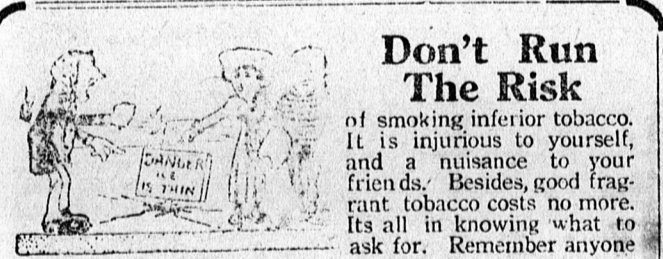
