# THE SENTENCE ON THIS MAN WAS TOO LIGHT

NEW YORK, December 24.—The man who does not believe in Santa Claus, was fined \$3 today for trying to convert his six-year-old son to his creed. Chief witness against him was his sister-in-law. She testified that she had pleaded and wept when he tried to persuade her boy that Santa was a myth. Her cries brought a policeman to the house, and the policeman brought the man to the station, where he was charged with disorderly conduct.  
 The man is Gustav Kotch. He lives in a flat in the Bronx.  
**A PLEA FOR SANTA CLAUSE.**  
 In a New York court, yesterday, a resident of the highest city in America was fined for disorderly conduct and in the hearing of the case it developed that the officer who made the arrest was attracted to the prisoner's house by the cries of a female relative, begging that the prisoner's six year old son should not be robbed of his infant beliefs regarding Santa Claus.  
 While fined merely for disorderly conduct, there will be general agreement, especially among parents, that the New York prisoner was in reality guilty of a more serious offence and yet one for which no punishment is provided in the statute books. He was deliberately attempting to steal from an innocent child one of the greatest pleasures of childhood—the belief in a kindly saint who visits good children annually and bestows on them the toys and candies in which they find their Christmas delight.  
 Santa Clause in the minds of adults may be regarded as a myth, but are we happier for the knowledge? What remembrance of childhood is comparable with that implicit belief in that mysterious personification of happiness, with his reindeer, his famous sleigh, his bag of toys, which like the widow's cruse of oil, was never emptied? And the day when we were disillusioned, was it not a dull grey day that marked the shaking of our childish faith?  
 It may be a mistake to foster in the heart and mind of a child the belief in the mysterious and elusive saint of Christmas time, but he that as it may, there are other illusions on which the light of absolute truth could shine more kindly. Children will soon enough come to know that many of their cherished idols are either non-existent or have feet of clay. There are so many important truths to teach. Can the life one is to be left in happiness with their Santa Clause? And when the knowledge does come as it must, he would be a hard-hearted parent indeed who wantonly and cruelly would find pleasure in telling. Let children have their Santa Claus, and with him the merriest Christmas of their lives.

## TO CLOSE BARS AT NOON SATURDAYS

TORONTO, December 23.—The possibility of further provincial restriction of the liquor traffic is under consideration in Queen's park.  
 The next regulation will probably close all bars in the province at one o'clock on Saturday, and for the entire day on legal holidays.  
 Such legislation would round out the restriction laid on the traffic last year, whereby the morning sale was materially shortened. It has been felt, moreover, that the Saturday afternoon trade militated against the spirit of recent regulations.  
 The arguments presented to the government in advocating shorter hours of sale on ordinary weekdays have been pressed strongly in reference to the new proposal. The case of the workman who is now relieved of the temptation of a morning 'nip' before work, is revived, to show that his salary envelope is in especial danger on the last afternoon of the week.  
 The question of prohibition on holidays has been under cabinet consideration for sometime. A special bill dealing with Good Friday restriction was voted down last session, on the understanding that the government would enquire into the feasibility of a more universal measure.  
 There is a further possibility of Ontario emulating the recent step taken by Quebec in cutting out C. O. B. orders for liquor, and preventing delivery after the closing hour of sale. The former practice is recognized as one of the strong branches of the trade in the larger cities. At present also, liquor bought before seven o'clock on Saturday evening may be delivered until midnight.
