INTERCOLONIAL AND GRAND TRUNK.

An effort is being now made to straighten out the tangle between the Intercolonial and Grand Trunk Railways, so that the Government road may obtain its fair share for the carriage of through freight passing over both roads. The Intercolonial people do not hesitate to say that the Government road suffers under the present arrangement. The Grand Trunk people have not been talking very much for publication, being apparently content with the arrangement as it is.

Mr. Wallace, the General Freight Agent of the I. C. R. is quoted in evidence to the effect that the Intercolonial lost \$4.20 on every car of freight shipped over the two roads from Chatham, Ont. to Halifax, and \$10.08 on every car from Chatham to St. John, this being because the earnings were not divided on a mileage basis. It may be assumed that the Grand Trunk was permitted to make what the Intercolonial lost, as otherwise the entire freight business between Ontario and the sea must have been carried at a loss, which is extremely improbable.

This condition of things no doubt accounts in large part for the deficits on the Intercolonial as the bulk of its through freight from the west was received from the Grand Trunk. It is affirmed that the agreement between Mr. Blair and Mr. Hays provided for a mileage basis, which would seem to be quite fair. The Intercolonial contention is however that the Grand Trunk refused to divide the earnings on this basis, but it is clear that the agreement must have been defective in some way, or it would have been capable of being enforced.

If the losses to the Intercolonial on through freight from other points in Ontario have been proportionate to those incurred on the freight from Chatham, and we presume this is so, either, the Grand Trunk people have been making big profits on this business, or the Ontario people have had the benefit of transportation over the I. C. R. at much less than cost, or both. It is certainly high time the matter was straightened out, but it may be suspected that the real trouble has arisen from the Grand Trunk line from Montreal to Portland being but a fraction of the length of the I. C. R. from Montreal to St. John or Halifax. It can be understood that the Grand Trunk would much prefer to keep the freight from the west on its own rails all the way to tidewater, and unless bound by a hard and fast agreement would not be willing to divide with the Intercolonial strictly on a mileage basis.

The Christmas mail of this year is reported by Postmaster Wheat as unusually heavy.

Mr. Carnegie by way of a Christmas present has added \$5,000,000 to the fund he created some time ago to provide retiring allowances for college professors.

Winding up the affairs of an insolvent loan company is sometimes a slow and costly process. The Farmers' Loan Company of Toronto failed some six years ago, and the winding up of its affairs is not yet completed, while the cost of the proceedings so far has been about \$200,000. This opens up rather an unattractive prospect for the shareholders in the York County Loan Company.

The examination of the New York State insurance officials before the Armstrong Committee has clearly demonstrated that their inspection of the insurance companies was so superficial as to be little more than a sham and a delusion.

Toronto bids fair to have a temperance Mayor next year, both the candidates in sight being well-known temperance men—Coatsworth and Spence. The latter has been an alderman of Toronto for some years and is well known in Charlottetown, having assisted in a Scott Act campaign here with great acceptance.

It appears there was more than one generous offer to place a telephone in Georgetown railway station. The Guardian has been shown the formal offer made by the W. K. Rogers' Co. Limited to install an instrument there for the use of their customers but open to use by the general public. This offer was made early on the 22nd to Superintendent Sharp and by him referred to General Manager Pottinger. The matter has now been solved in another way.

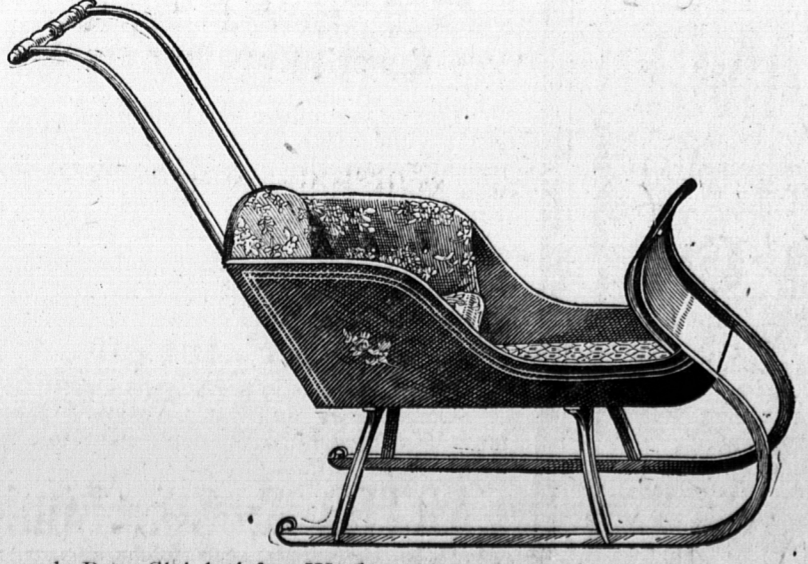
