PROGRESS in opening the Midland Railway line is being made by crews of from eighty to one hundred men working from both ends. Between South Maitland and Windsor there lie about 26 miles of track covered with an average depth of snow of four feet. The rails are covered with ice. The surface of the snow has a stiff crust, which requires to be broken with axes and broad bladed knives. Once the crust is broken shovels may be used. After the snow is removed picks are required to clear the road-bed.
