THE WAR AGAINST TUBERCULOSIS.

Some time ago The Guardian mentioned the good results in the British Isles and in portions of the United States from the measures that had been taken for the prevention and cure of tuberculosis. We have now at hand a statement of the Anti-Tuberculosis Association of Ontario showing the good results of like measures in that Province. These are most encouraging. In the last ten years of the nineteenth century, out of every one thousand deaths in Ontario 116 were those of persons dying from tuberculosis. In the first ten years of the twentieth century the deaths from the same disease in Ontario had been reduced to 76 per thousand. This favorable change in the mortality from the white plague, as it is called, has resulted almost entirely from the educational efforts and the sanitary measures taken to prevent and cure this dread disease. Very little was done or attempted to that end between 1890 and 1900. Since the latter date a good deal of effort has been made by way of disseminating information and the establishing of sanatoria, and in securing better home treatment for the afflicted ones, as well as in introducing precautionary measures to prevent the spread of infection. These measures have been progressive and are now much more extensive and effectual than they were in the earlier years of the current decade.

The statement is therefore not only a most hopeful one on its face, but will appear the more so the more closely it is examined. What has been achieved in ten years is in brief the reduction of the number of deaths from this one dread malady by one-third of the total. Very few, if any at all had hoped for such splendid results when the work was begun. Many believed the warfare against tuberculosis was almost hopeless when it was first entered upon. Now even the most incredulous must be convinced that the work is worth while, and productive of excellent results, while those who had a little faith at first have become established believers and will work harder than before.

The reduction of one-third in the death-rate from tuberculosis in Ontario by demonstrating the efficiency of the educative, preventive and curative measures and precautions taken cannot but have the effect of stimulating the good work, enlisting new workers, and calling forth more and larger contributions toward carrying it on. Governments, federal, provincial and municipal which may have been hesitating will be induced to act, and in view of all these conditions there is reason to hope that a great further reduction of the mortality from consumption will be brought about in the years next to come. Our own Province has as yet done little beyond making a beginning. The good results shown in Ontario make it apparent that if we are to keep pace with the sister Provinces and with the civilized world in this great warfare we must be up and doing and much more earnest and energetic than we have hitherto been.

DOUKHOBOR DIVORCES.

Canadian Colliers tells of troubles with the Doukhobors in the matter of marriage and divorce. With all their tendency to be religious over much these strange people have rather loose ideas in regard to both marriage and divorce and at the last sitting of the court in Yorkton, Man., three Doukhobors were adjudged to be guilty of bigamy, much against their alleged conscientious convictions. They get into this tangle by practising divorce by consent, for which they claim to find a warrant in the Old Testament. "They do not think it wrong any more than taking off all their clothes and going upon a naked pilgrimage."

It appears that divorce by consent is an old practice among these strange people. They brought it from Russia and one of the first things they complained of as a form of persecution in Canada was that restrictions were placed upon their liberties in this matter. They filed their protest long ago at Ottawa where it was probably put safely away in some pigeon-hole. But they will not abide by or accept the Canadian law of marriage. They marry at convenience and separate at will, both the separated ones holding themselves immediately eligible for a new union. And they have little regard for the civil law as for Ne Temere Decrees in such matters. In short, as Colliers puts it, "a Doukhobor marriage is an off-again-on-again-gone-again - Finnegan sort of arrangement, as facile as their courtships."

HALIFAX, May 27—The Niobe leaves Halifax for a cruise in the St. Lawrence on May 28th. She is to arrive at Quebec on June first. The first ship will remain there till June 5th, taking part in the ceremonies attending on the sailing of the Coronation Contingent from Quebec on June 2nd.

Leaving Quebec on June 5th, the Niobe will arrive at Charlottetown June 8th. She will remain in the vicinity of Charlottetown until July 10th, carrying out sanitary practices and firing, and visiting Charlottetown for the week end. On July 14th the cruiser will arrive at Quebec, when the Coronation Contingent will rejoin her. This is the official schedule.
