OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

A titled Irishwoman who has a large country seat and entertains a great deal, has hit upon a charming device for making breakfast a more cheerful function than it generally is. Instead of the one long, dreary table at which everybody must eat, she has in the breakfast room several small round tables, each with its own separate service. Let a guest come down at what hour he will, he finds hot coffee and tea over the spirit-heaters, on the side table, and hot cups—some of them the thick china cups which are used in the inns of Normandy, and which keep the heat so well. Crisp French rolls, portions of butter, and various breakfast delicacies are in readiness, too, and a guest can take what he wishes and sit down at a little table, alone or with a friend, and take his coffee in what is almost as good as solitude.

"Yes," said a florist, "I can work miracles in my business. For instance, I can grow you lettuce while you wait—sweet, crisp lettuce that you may eat for your dinner with the broiled spring chicken. I do it in this way. I take a handful of lettuce seeds that have been soaked over night in alcohol, and I plant them in a box containing three inches of soil, and in ten minutes the seeds burst. In twenty minutes two tiny leaves push through the earth. In an hour they are as big as half-dollars. Then you may pluck and eat them. They are delicious—a fairy salad. Sometimes, when I give a dinner party, I have one of these little prepared lettuce beds in the centre of the table. The guests see the lettuce grow, and when the time comes for the salad course, there is salad blooming before them, all ready for them to pluck."

TODAY IN DOMINION HISTORY

Dr. Albert Ross Hill, president of the State University of Missouri and one of the most eminent of American educators, was born in Nova Scotia forty-four years ago today, the son of Daniel and Esther Davison Hill. He received his early education in the schools of his native Province, and at the age of sixteen became a teacher in the schools of Nova Scotia. He received the degree of A. B. from Dalhousie University in 1892, and then went to Germany, where he studied at Berlin, Heidelberg and Strasbourg. In 1895 Cornell made him a Ph. D., and he began his career as an educator at the State Normal School, Oshkosh, Wis., soon after marrying Agnes S. Baxter, of Halifax. Since then he has been a member of the faculties of Cornell, Nebraska and Missouri, and was elected president of the University of Missouri in 1906.

October 4 is the birthday of the Rt. Rev. George Thornloe, Bishop of Algoma, former rector of St. Peter, Sherbrooke, and Canon of Quebec Cathedral, at Coventry, 1848; of Henry Frederick Dissett, who won high honors as a British commissioner in Africa, at Montreal, 1847, and of Dr. Charles William Edmund Body, theologian, who was provost and vice-chancellor of Trinity University, Toronto, 1881-94, at Clapham, Eng., 1851. On this date in 1899 the Hon. Amedee Emmanuel Forget was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the Northwest Territories, serving until 1905, when he became the first Lieutenant-Governor of Saskatchewan. It was the anniversary of the sending of the first message over the Canadian government telegraph line from Skaaguay.

NEW GLASGOW DEVELOPMENT CO. LTD.

Our neighboring City of New Glasgow has certainly been taking on new life very rapidly during the past year. The immense plant of the Eastern Car Company, Limited, which will employ 1500 men, would alone support quite a town, but this is only one of several things which is giving New Glasgow a boost at this time. The Standard Clay Works which was already a large concern, has more than doubled its capacity. The Brown Machine Company and the Bailey-Underwood Company have consolidated as the Eastern Steel Company with largely increased capital. They have acquired a large tract of land and will build a modern plant for the manufacture of steel castings in addition to their present lines of work. Many houses have been built, but the demand has been so great that men have had to go eight or ten miles from their work in some cases to get a place to live.

Recently a Company has been formed by some of the citizens for the development of New Glasgow. They have purchased a large tract of land on the West side of the river opposite the principal works, and will build a bridge across the river to put this property within walking distance of the larger industries. The Company has been incorporated as the New Glasgow Development Company, Limited. It is their purpose to build a model town with regular streets and sidewalks. The whole plot with the exception of one or two streets will be restricted to good residences. In another column this Company makes announcement of the opening of this property October 8th, at 2 p. m., when a sale will be held on the ground.

As some of the leading citizens of New Glasgow have taken hold of this work, we shall shortly expect to see a fine addition to New Glasgow, which all means larger market for the farmers of P. E. Island. 1900

TODAY WE CELEBRATE

Greatest of all American Indians, a brave warrior, a Napoleonic leader of men, an able statesman, an eloquent orator, a diplomat of rare ability,—such was Tecumseh, chief of the Shawnees, who was slain in the battle of the Thames, in Canada, just a century ago tomorrow.

A cloud of witnesses attest Tecumseh's bravery, sagacity and nobility of character. Major-General Sir Brock, commander of the English forces in Canada at the outbreak of the last war between England and the United States, wrote of his red-skinned ally, "A more sagacious and active man does not, I believe, exist."

As Chief of the Shawnees, he attempted to organize the western Indians against the whites, and in this project he had the assistance of his brother, Elkawatawa, "the Prophet," a great religious leader among the Indians. The latter was defeated by Harrison at Tippecanoe in 1811, and Tecumseh then offered his services to the British. Acting with such brave English leaders as Brock and Harvey, he was almost invincible, and his Indians would do anything for him—even refrain from massacre and torture.

BATHING COSTUMES
(London Chronicle)

Dr. Fortescue Fox told the Medical Congress that the benefits derived from bathing vary largely according to the climate of the place in which the baths are taken. This belief is evidently shared by the Nicaraguans. Mr. Archibald Solquhoun relates that "there is a strong prejudice in Nicaragua against bathing, and even washing, while on a journey and for some days afterward. The dust is not washed off the face for some days after arrival, especially if the traveler has come from the 'tierras calientes' (hot country, or lower region), for a too sudden opening of the pores of the skin will certainly produce fever, according to popular belief. The people of Nicaragua, according to Squier, 'are generally scrupulously clean in their persons, except when travelling, and then the use of water is prohibited.'"

THE HUMAN PROCESSION

Col. His Highness Sir Nripendra Narayan Bhup Badahur, Maharajah of Cooch Behar, was born fifty-one years ago today, and succeeded his father at the tender age of ten months. The Maharajah's son, Prince Jitendra, a handsome youth of twenty-six, recently married Princess Indira, the only daughter of the Gaekwar of Baroda. The wedding was originally scheduled to take place in India last May, but the bride changed her mind and sailed away to England. Later Prince Jitendra and his brother, the Maharaja of Cooch Behar, proceeded to London, where the delayed wedding ceremony was performed. The royal family of the Gaekwar of Baroda is descended from the gods. This claim of divine origin has been denied, however, and jealous rivals say that the Cooch Behar royal line is of aboriginal descent. The Gaekwar of Baroda, father of the bride, is a scion of one of the oldest families of India, and his ancestors once ruled over a large part of the country. The Maharajah is a famous Nimrod, and the author of "Thirty-seven years of Big Game Shooting."

John A. Sleicher, publisher of Judge and Leslie's Weekly, was born in Troy, N.Y., sixty-five years ago today. In his youth he was reporter and city editor of the Press, Times, and Whig, in his native city, and later was proprietor of the Schenectady Union, and editor-in-chief of the Albany Evening Journal and the New York Mail and Express.
