A PASTOR IN
CHADWICK CASE.

The Preacher of Rockefeller Formed the Intermediary Through Which She Met Brookline Man.

CLEVELAND, O., Dec. 12.—It was through the Rev. Charles A. Eaton, pastor of the Euclid Avenue Baptist Church of this city (John D. Rockefeller's church) that Mrs. Cassie Chadwick became acquainted with Banker Newton of Brookline, Mass., by means of a letter to a Boston attorney, a relative of Dr. Eaton.

The clergyman made a statement regarding the matter in the following communication, dated at Louisville, Ky., which was received here today.

"CAME TO ME UNBIDDEN."
"Some time last winter or spring Mrs. Chadwick appeared unbidden and unknown at my office and, as hundreds of strangers do, asked for my advice. My advice was to place her affairs unreservedly in the hands of lawyers or business men of integrity for settlement, and I sent her to several firms in which I had and have now the greatest confidence, telling them frankly what little I knew about the woman and that I had advised her to place her entire affairs with them for settlement.

"Since then I have known nothing about her movements except by hearsay, nor do I remember having seen or heard of her before this occasion.

NEVER AT HIS CHURCH.

"Mrs. Chadwick never attended a church service in the Euclid Avenue Baptist Church, within my knowledge, and has never given a dollar to our work, directly or indirectly. She is not now and never has been connected in any way with my church, or with its pastor, other than as stated above.

The statement is printed here that Banker Newton's hope to secure a settlement for his claim was due to the fact that Dr. Eaton was John D. Rockefeller's pastor, and that the latter would believe from embarrassment his favorite clergyman by paying Newton all that was owed him.

TEAM FROM
THE KLONDIKE

Dawson City Hockey Players Are Coming East.

MONTREAL, Dec. 12.—The Yukon Hockey Club from Dawson City will come 4000 miles to try and capture the Stanley cup, this cup an immense silver bowl, which was presented for perpetual championship competition by the present Earl of Derby, when he was Lord Stan ear, Governor-General of Canada, exemplifies the championship of the world in hockey, as it were.

Incidentally the club will play a number of exhibition matches with other clubs in Canada and the United States, and will spend a month at least in the realms of civilization.

They will leave Dawson City Dec. 10, after the elections in the Klondike are over, and will play in Ottawa in the early part of January, returning home in March when the ice and snow will be still good to travel over.

They are now playing a series of four matches among themselves for the purpose of deciding what men they will take upon the trip. They have already decided upon a captain, W. C. Young, known as "Weldy," who some years ago was one of the fastest and trickiest forwards on the Ottawa senior team.

There are two wonderful things about the trip. First that it will cost \$10,000, and that the most they can only gain a small part of that by the matches they will play; and secondly, that they intend to do 380 miles of their journey on foot. This will be the distance between Dawson and White Horse, and they expect to do that in a week or a little over.

As Capt Young wires over the more than 4000 miles of pure copper telegraph wire which connects the gold country with Montreal and this part of Canada; "The walk will keep us in good condition." The \$10,000 necessary for the expenses of the trip is guaranteed by the people of the Yukon.
