The death occurred at Mount Carmel, on Sunday night last, of Mrs. Francis Gallant, relict of the late John Gallant, at the advanced age of one hundred and one years and ten months. Deceased whose maiden name was Frances Arsenault, was highly respected in the community in which she lived and had the distinction of being one of the two or three oldest persons in the community, if not in the Province. She is survived by two brothers, Melrose Arsenault, Mount Carmel, aged 88; and Alexis Arsenault, aged 88, and two sisters, Mrs. John DesRoches, Tigulish, aged 97; and Mrs. Amade Gallant, aged 80. Her son Sylvain Gallant will celebrate his golden wedding in July and her grand-daughter Mrs. John J. Gallant her silver wedding in August. Her descendants number three sons and two daughters, 35 grandchildren, 115 great-grandchildren, and three great-great-grandchildren.
