HATS FOR WINTER MILLINERY.—The beavers, which drape as gracefully as the softest velvets, are the smartest materials for street hats. Fanne and mirois velvet are also fashioned into hats of rare beauty. Hats made of taffeta, either draped or formed into petals, which overlay each other, continue in favor. Hats of fur are even more fashionable than formerly. A beautiful hat was in the popular low, flat shape with the crown and upper brim made entirely of squirrel and the facing of white chiffon laid in tiny plaits. Two white plumes provided the only decoration. Hats of sealskin are something of a novelty, but are extremely smart. The heavy Spanish and Russian turbans suggest a pleasing use for this fur as well as for Persian and baby-lamb. Sable, Mink, chinchilla and ermine, are other furs employed upon stylish headgear. The picture hat is much seen this season in velvet, beaver and lace. Hats made of chamouis are charming and novel, and low, flat, sailors made in winter materials are popular.—From the Delineator for January.
