PROHIBITION COMMISSION ACCOUNTS - Mr. McLure gave notice that he will ask the Hon. the Provincial

Treasurer to lay on the table pursuant to section 180 of "The Prohibition Act", the half-yearly returns of the Board of Commissioners, for the half years ending 30th June 1929 and 31st December 1929, which shall contain the following information:

(a) A list of convictions made under this Act during the six months preceding the date of the return with the name and address of the offender, the date of the conviction, the penalty imposed and the term of imprisonment ordered, where no pecuniary penalty is imposed, and the costs in each case.

(b) A statement of the penalties and costs collected with names and dates of payment, and dates of convictions and license fees collected.

(c) A list of convicted offenders who have served terms of imprisonment with dates of convictions and the periods of imprisonment served.

(d) A statement of seizures made under this Act with particulars of goods seized and the disposal thereof.

(e) A statement of the expenses paid, with such details as may be required by the Provincial Treasurer.

(f) A statement of the amount expended for the purchase of liquors.

(g) A statement of the amount expended for the payment of the salaries and travelling expenses of inspectors, managers, vendors, and other employees, and for rent, shops and warehouses and for necessary expenses.

(h) A statement of all receipts received for the sale of liquor.
