OUR PROVINCE REJOICES IN THE SUCCESS

That Her Sons Have Won in Activities of Life in All Parts of the World.

THE ORATION OF REV. J. M. REARDON.

The renewal of Friendship's Bonds by our Island Sons Who Have Been Scattered in All Parts of the World—Greetings From the North Western States of America.

It is with pleasure that The Guardian reproduces in full this morning the eloquent address delivered by Rev. J. M. Reardon at the recent Ireland's Celebration in Summerside during Old Home Week.

On an occasion like the present, when Islanders of Irish blood assemble to greet with words of welcome their fellow countrymen returning from abroad, it may not be inappropriate to apply to our Island home the words addressed by the late John Boyle O'Reilly to the Island home of our forefathers:—What were death to another is Ireland's salvation.

It is to be deplored, however, that although our Island has ever been the abode of peace and plenty, her limited resources have proved insufficient to support those who in the natural course of development make demands upon her, and as a result our surplus population is scattered throughout the length and

breadth of the neighboring continent. The name and fame of this Garden of the Gulf are not unknown in that vast Republic to the South that extends from Plymouth Rock to the Golden Gate; and if we were to take a census of those who abide within its borders we would find that there are few towns or cities of any consequence that do not possess their quota of the hardy sons and daughters of P. E. I.

This occasion not inaptly reminds us of that scene recorded in sacred history wherein wise men from the East in the days of long ago became embued with the inspiration of their age and hastened to the west to enjoy the full fruition of the glorious possibilities for good which they saw unveiled before them.

When that day dawns the historian of the future, who records the events of this year of grace 1904 will give due credit to the leaders of thought and action in this western part of our Island province for having evolved this unique celebration.
