### THE TELEPHONE SERVICE.

The letter from Dr. Dewar which appears in another column of this issue serves as a reminder that the charter of the P. E. Island Telephone Company is about to expire and that a new arrangement of some sort must be entered upon in the near future either by extending the charter of the Company upon the present terms, or on amended terms, or by some new arrangement.

We cannot do without the telephone in this age of the world and especially on this Island where it has so largely taken the place of the telegraph in communications from one part of the Province to another. It is also a fair subject for consideration whether in a thickly settled community like ours the number of offices might not be greatly increased and the rates lowered so as to give our people something like the advantages on equal terms with those now enjoyed by the people of Sweden.

As suggested by Dr. Dewar The Guardian would be much pleased to have an expression of opinion from each and all of our Representatives in the Legislature on the following points:

- (1) Do you favor Federal ownership and operation of the telephone?
- (2) Failing the taking over of the tele-

phone system by the Federal Government, do you favor the Provincial Government purchasing and operating the telephone lines in this Province?

(3) Are you in favor of extending the charter of the P. E. Island Telephone Company on the terms of their present contract, and if not what changes would you suggest?

The matter is a highly important one affecting the interests and convenience of a very large number of persons and cannot be too carefully considered before definite legislative action is taken, which may fix matters beyond our power to change them for long years in the future.

We shall be glad to receive and publish the replies of our Representatives to the above questions. In the meantime it is clearly in the interest of the Telephone Company to afford every reasonable convenience and the best service possible to their regular patrons and the public generally during the remaining months of probation before the Legislature shall meet and take action.

Home Rule must be a prominent factor in the coming British elections. The Nationalists will make it such in Ireland. Premier Bannerman is committed to Home Rule by a public address delivered some time ago, and Mr. Chamberlain will hold him responsible for that avowal. The fact that Home Rule is not popular in England or Scotland makes it certain that the Opposition will as far as possible keep it to the front.

Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, who is having electric motor cars built for the C. P. R., stated in a recent interview that he foresaw the day when electric power will take the trains from the Atlantic to the Pacific. Mr. Edison says that within fifteen years all the railways will be using electricity on their trunk lines for the reason that it will give better results in speed and will also be found more economical. He hopes in that time also to see electric power developed direct from coal without burning it away under boilers.
