#### CARDINAL RECEIVES HIS BERETTA.

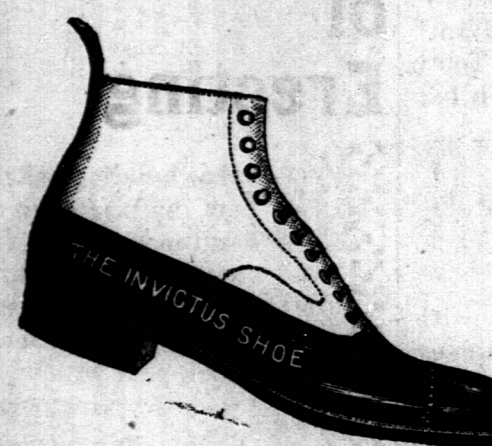

## PRISONER

### ESCAPED

#### Yesterday 'Morning From Queen's Co. Jail,

### HE SCALED THE FENCE

#### And Took a Sail on the Placid Waters of the Hillsboro River.

James Gormley, a prisoner in Queen's County Jail, under a twelve month sentence for assaulting Simon Joseph, an Arab, quietly and in an unostentatious manner, left the Jail yesterday morning. He did not bid the Jailor or any of his family good-bye, neither did he inform him before hand of his intention. He was not even released by Habeas Corpus. He simply found the door leading into the yard used by the female prisoners open and he went out, probably with the innocent intention of flitting through the windows, with some of the female prisoners. When he, however, reached the yard, on seeing a ladder the exact length, idly standing against the fence he must have considered freedom more profitable than flirtation and changed his mind, for he immediately climbed up the ladder and landed on the street. He is still outside. In fact, yesterday afternoon, he and some of his friends took a sail along the placid waters of the Hillsborough, which after his three months incarceration, or voyage in Hamilton's Brig was found quite pleasant and enjoyable. In the meantime his presence as one of the scrubbers of the jail attic was missed and upon inquiring from some of the other scrubbers, the jailor was informed that young Gormley had gone to look after the dinner, which Jailor Hamilton may or may not have thought was a satisfactory explanation of Gormley's absence. But Gormley did not come back and did not, as afterward learned, prepare any menu or dinner for his fellow prisoners. He dined out himself.

New York, May 2.—An experiment intended to develop a trust in waiters was begun yesterday by 100 leading hotel and restaurant men in New York. They opened a free employment bureau for waiters at No. 20 West Twenty-ninth street.
