The schooner Swift Current, one of the fleet of vessels that drove ashore in the big gale on Saturday, September 30, was sold at auction yesterday for the benefit of all concerned and purchased by Joseph Salters Sons of North Sydney. The Swift Current was built at St. Margaret's Bay in 1885, and was owned by her master, Capt. John Hannam. Since stranding an effort was made to float her by the tug Douglas H. Thomas, but proved unsuccessful. The vessel was condemned on Saturday last by Capt. Thomas Desmond and John Tuck, who held a survey on her. She is pretty badly damaged, and it has not yet been decided whether or not another attempt will be made to float her—Sydney ex. (The Swift Current was owned formerly by Capt. John Chapman, Murray Harbor, and was a frequent caller in this port.)

RE-OPENING OF HANDSOME CHURCH

Sunday, October 22nd, was a red-letter day with the members of the Baptist denomination of Westmoreland, P. E. Island. It marks an epoch in their history and it was an occasion that will always be looked back upon with pleasure and profit. The church, which had been closed for public worship since June, was again opened and the congregation worshipped in their enlarged and improved building. The three services were attended by a concourse of people that completely filled the edifice, leaving many unable to get seats. The re-opening service was held at 10.30 o'clock, and was conducted by the pastor Rev. Wm. M. Field, who paid a high and well merited tribute to the committee for the grand construction work effected by them. In proceeding with his discourse, wished to emphasize the fact that consecration did not merely mark the formal opening of another place of worship, it meant the act of setting apart forever the edifice to the honor and glory of God. The afternoon and evening services were marked by two able sermons by Rev. Mr. Fernon, Craignud (Episcopal) and Rev. Wm. Thomson, Tyron (Methodist). Both congratulated the congregation on the fact of the church being re-opened and that now it was an edifice with an interior more beautiful than ever. The offering of the day amounted to \$150.00.

The contractors have done their work well and the result is that the building is now one of the most commodious, beautiful and comfortable churches in the country. The alterations have been done extensively. Fifteen feet have been added to the main building. The windows are striking and handsome. The platform space is much greater than formerly, the choir loft being placed immediately behind the pulpit. The old pews have given away to new circular seats, new carpets of a rich, but quiet shade have been laid on the platform and new linoleum on the aisles. A tower projecting its full size from the wall of the building stands at the side of the front corner, with an entrance to the ground floor. The walls are finished in the new or rough style plastering with wainscoting of hard-wood and the effect while simple, in addition with the ceiling finished in rose is very pretty. Westmoreland's congregation have good cause to feel proud of their beautiful church property. The parish over which Pastor Field presides, includes in addition to Westmoreland, Tryon, Albany and Bonshaw. He has seen improvements in each of the districts. The church property at Albany was re-modelled. At Tryon a Baptistery installed and also fifteen feet added to the parsonage barr—At Bonshaw a fence placed around the property and minor improvements carried out. The result is an evidence of what pastor and congregation can do when they work to gether in harmony.

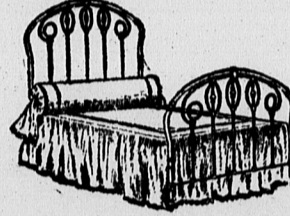
