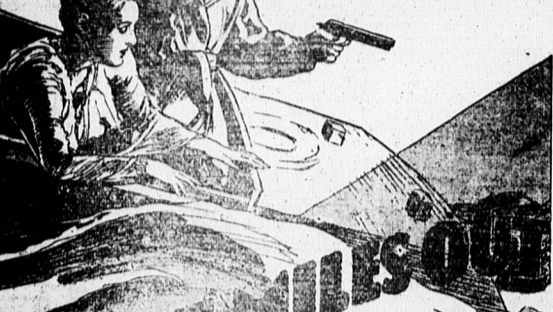

Canadian Dancing Record Is Broken

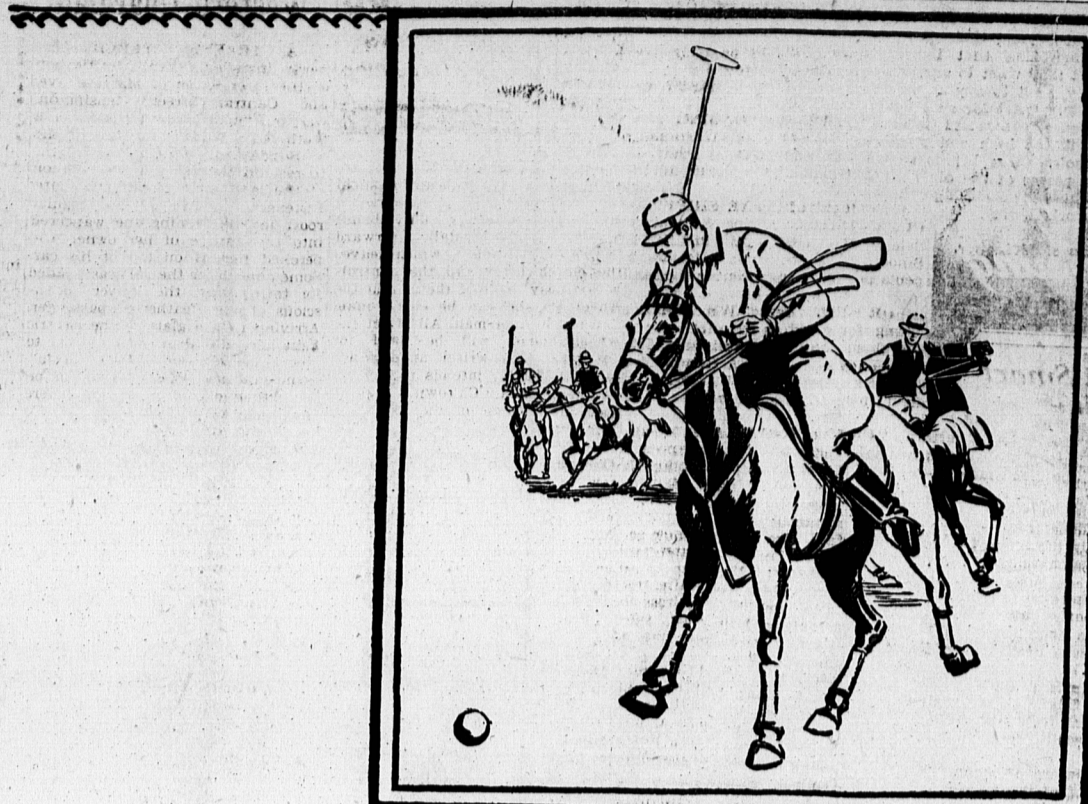
