EMERGENCY BISCUITS.

Two cups flour, 1 tablespoon shortening, 1 cup thick sour milk, ½ teaspoonful salt, ½ teaspoonful soda, sift the flour, salt and soda well together. Rub in the shortening with a spoon. Add the milk and stir lightly. The dough should be soft. Drop by spoonfuls into greased muffin-tins and bake in a hot oven about twenty minutes.
