TUESDAY

The latest contribution to the housekeeper's assistance is the "dish laundry." A company known as the "Dish Laundry" is incorporated in New York to do the dishwashing of the big metropolises. The price is to be 20 cents a day for three meals in a family of two, with five cents for each additional person except guests the family who will not be charged. The company will provide each family with two boxes, one for china and silver-ware and one for pots and pans. Polite employees in uniform will call for the dishes after each meal, and after washing and drying will return them to the company agree to pay for all losses or breakages. To reduce these to a minimum employees are paid a bonus of \$2 a week if they do not break or lose a dish, and are docked in pay if they do. The dishes are washed in families are kept separate, every dish is sterilized after washing, and pots and pans scoured.

The scheme is designed to reduce the labor of housekeeping and especially to assist those who cannot get or afford to keep the necessary domestic help. Bachelor housekeepers are expected to find the dish laundry very useful.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier in his address at Winnipeg on Saturday last set at rest the rather improbable rumor that a general election might be held this year by giving it a distinct denial. Sir Wilfrid today, in his address, said that he would be everywhere accepted. As the census will be taken in June next it is now tolerably safe to say that no general appeal to the people of the Dominion will be made until after the census, and the enactment of a redistribution bill based thereon.

It is a rather sad commentary upon our civilization that first to Sydney and now to Sprynghill troops have had to be sent to keep the peace. And the local municipal authorities must pay the heavy cost. There were 240 deaths in Montreal last week, being 42 in excess of the number of births of these deaths 154 were of children under five years of age. This looks like a veritable slaughter of the innocents. The heat alone is not chargeable. The want of pure water, wholesome milk and good sanitation is indicated. Large cities may be made and kept beautiful.

It has been the same in other Provinces, in the Dominion and in the United States. National, state, provincial and civic indebtedness is increasing. The craze for borrowing and spending is widespread. M. T. Heirik, a former Governor of Ohio, tells that the expenditures of the Washington Government are increasing twice as fast and the expenditures of the State governments three times as fast as the wealth of the country. In ten years past, 45 leading cities including New York, have increased their debt by 47.71 per cent and their valuation by only 12.66 per cent. Thus in the cities the debt grows almost four times as fast as the wealth. What will the end be?
