SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON GIRL TO SERVE SEVEN YEARS FOR PETTY THEFT

NOVEMBER 28. PAUL ON SELF-DENIAL. (World's Temperance Lesson.) Rom 14:10-21. GOLDEN TEXT.

"It is good not to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor to do anything whereby thy brother stumbleth."—Rom. 14:21.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.
The great temperance movement of our time is distinctly a social movement. It has a sociological basis. It is a movement of Christian socialism. It is inconceivable that any order, organization, union, or society of men, which aims at the world's betterment can be unindifferent to the relation of the temperance movement to such betterment.

Very few, if any, of them are. That is why the liquor seller has been blackballed from lodge after lodge. He has become a social outcast. He is a pariah. No one can hold fellowship with him. The pledges and covenants of any organization which is working for the uplift of men in any direction, with one whose business means the ruin of men in every direction—the ruin of body and soul and estate.

But there can be no society without the units which compose it. And the principles of society are not valid, (i.e.) they are not good if they in any way smother or destroy those who unite as such. Our lesson will not have it so. Paul will not have it so. "We shall all stand before the judgment seat of God." "Each one of us shall give account of himself to God."

Accordingly, the issue is personal. The lesson is without value save as it is made personal. As it relates, therefore, to the temperance question, or to the manufacture or sale or use of intoxicating liquors as a leverage, the application of the teaching of the lesson must be made direct and personal. Have I the right to manufacture? Have I the right to sell? Have I the right to drink? If so, under what circumstances am I compelled to forego the right to manufacture or sell or use?

The apostle lays down a principle of self-denial which is binding upon the conscience, the betrayal of which, he teaches, will be actionable at the judgment seat. If harm shall come to another because of the selfish assertion and pursuit of right it shall mean the rejection of Christ-joy, which is not faith, and which, therefore, is sin. "Destroy not with thy meat him for whom Christ died." "Whatsoever is not of faith is sin."

Moreover, that is a poor estimate of the fitness and proportion of things which would fasten itself to a gratification of the flesh at the cost of heart-qualities or graces, which are eternal. Meat and drink are perishable, and their enjoyment momentary, but it is not so with love and peace and joy in the Holy Ghost. The principles of the kingdom of God are eternal. The joys of them are never-fading joys. No regrets follow upon the action (it may be, it often will be, one of self-denial) which they father.

What argument can bolster the existence of the liquor traffic in the presence of the sigh from the broken heart of one poor drunkard's wife? The thing which can produce that must be vetoed and out-lawed. It is a bad thing. That our Lord made wine or that the business of liquor selling has been so long legitimate that property or vested rights are involved, or that personal liberty is being assailed, are shallow subtleties of Satanic selfishness when put forth as reasons for the drink traffic. The grave of the drunkard, the cry of the children, the impoverishment of the nation, the desolation and ruin of homes; reasons hygienic and economical and social and moral, apart from those distinctly worshipful and spiritual, throw us back upon the supreme principle of conduct (Pauline and Christ-like) of self-denial.

MOBILE, Nov. 17—Miss Lillie Sutton of Ocean Springs, Miss., who was sentenced last spring to seven years in prison for the theft of a half pound of butter and five eggs, voluntarily gave herself up yesterday to the Sheriff, the supreme court having affirmed the sentence.
