N. Y., Montreal Stocks Up; Prices Mixed At Toronto

NEW YORK, Oct. 6—(AP)—The stock market resumed its rise today after Tuesday's setback. Demand for steel shares touched off a fairly broad advance late in the first hour. The balance of the day was devoted successfully to holding those gains. At the final bell quotations were up fractions to more than a point.
 The rise in prices was accompanied by larger volume. Sales of 10,000,000 represented considerable improvement over Tuesday's 550,000 shares.
 The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced 3 of one point to 68.2. The rail component made the best showing, with the industrial section in second place.

TORONTO, Oct. 6—(CP)—Prices were mixed in increased trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange today. Base metals firmed and golds advanced. However, the market was weakened at the close.
 Base metals were the strongest in the mining groups as most issues traded actively for moderate gains. Consolidated Smelters rose 1-2 at 115 1-2 and International Nickel added fractional gains. Waste Amulet advanced 15 cents at \$9.35 and Torbit Silver, Labrador and Pend Oreille were gainers.
 Hollinger and Tech-Hughes dipped slightly in the senior golds while a few junior issues gained pennies on brisk action.

MONTREAL, Oct. 6—(CP)—Papers continued to feature a firmer selected industrial list on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curbside Market today as most groups displayed further fractional advances. Gains narrowly edged out losses in a quiet mine group.
 Trading was active in earlier trading, but at the close of trading it slipped to moderately active. A few leaders appeared in better demand.
 Industrial sales were approximately 42,000 shares, an increase of 4,800 shares over yesterday's total. Mining turnover was 62,900 shares, compared with 64,900 shares in the preceding session.
 Closing averages indicated banks off .05 at 26.48; utilities off .3 at 71.6; industrials up .3 at 129.4; papers up 3/32 at 351.78 and golds off .05 at 59.81.

LONDON, Oct. 6—(Reuters)—British Government stocks made further upward progress in the London Stock Exchange today. Buying was spread over a broad list and resulted in gains of up to 3-16. Once again the small investor provided the bulk of the day's business.
 The international situation continued to encourage a note of caution in markets which today nevertheless provided any signs of real life.
