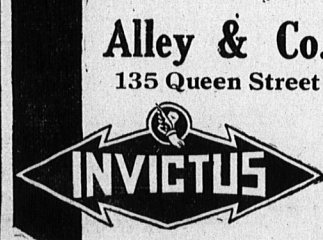

THE FIGHT ON PLAINS OF TROY

Romantic Setting for Battle During Siege of Dardanelles

On the ancient plains of Troy, famed in Homeric poem as the battle ground of supermen contending for the favor of the fair Helen, Britain and French infantrymen rounded up and made prisoners of a myriad Turkish soldiers and German officers.

MONTREAL, June 15.—There was no improvement in the foreign demand for wheat here to-day, and business in consequence continues very dull.

CHICAGO, June 15.—Wheat fell to-day as low as \$1 per bushel, September delivery. Corn reflected the weakness of wheat and closed 1 3/4c. down, while oats remained about steady.

WINNIPEG, June 15.—Wheat dropped under one dollar to-day. Damage reports from the south, however, caused a steadiness for some here to-day. Fair demand for car lots and sales of No. 3 Canadian Western were made at 59c., extra No. 1 feed at 59 and local No. 2 white at 58 1/2c.

LIVE STOCK MARKET, Toronto.—Receipts at the Union Stock Yards to-day were 700 head of cattle, 1,245 hogs and 222 sheep and lambs. There was a lighter run of cattle and the market closed steady with yesterday's prices.

Dairy Produce: At Gould's Cold Storage to-day the offerings amounted to 700 cases of butter, for which the demand was fairly good and all sold at 27 to 27 1/4c. per lb. delivered here.

EGGS: There was no important change in the condition of the market to-day, the feature being firm under a steady demand from English buyers for supplies, and a fair amount of business is doing in this direction.

CHICAGO: Prospects of better weather for the Kansas harvest and therefore a new crop, brought about a fall in the price of wheat to-day, notwithstanding an upturn at the start, quotations being 3c. under that of Saturday. Oats were partly sustained by good foreign demand at the seaboard.

WINNIPEG: Exporters were buying Nos. 1 and 3 grades of what in limited quantities, while other grades were not asked for, and cash prices again dropped from 1c. to 2 1/4c. per bushel. There was a fair enquiry for all grades of oats, but not much offered, while barley and flax were not asked for.

TORONTO: Grain markets again closed very weak and from 2c. to 3c. lower than Saturday's closing prices. Cash wheat business still very dull.

MONTREAL: The feature of the local grain market to-day was the stronger feeling for western oats and prices were advanced 1c. per bushel. There continues to be steady demand from foreign buyers, but owing to the continued scarcity of ocean room to most ports little business is being done.

Baled Hay: The market for baled hay is without any new feature to

note, prices being firm with a fair trade passing for local account, and sales of car lots of No. 1 hay were made at \$21 to \$21.50 and No. 2 hay at \$19 to \$19.50 per ton ex-truck.

Hogs: The feature of the hog situation to-day was the weaker feeling in the market for live hogs and prices as compared with the week ago declined 10c. to 20c. per 100 lbs.

Live Stock: A feature of the live stock trade this week was the weaker feeling in the market for butchers' cows and bulls and prices for all grades ruled lower on account of the fact that supplies of such coming forward of late have been rather in excess of requirements, and sales of full loads of choice cows were made at \$7 to \$7.25 and bulls at \$7.50 to \$7.75 per 100 lbs.

Dairy Produce: A firmer feeling is developing in the local butter situation under a fairly good demand from local buyers as they all seem disposed to carry a small stock of creamery.

At the auction sale held at the Board of Trade to-day fine creamery sold at 1/4c. higher than last Friday's prices. There was no further change in the condition of the cheese market to-day, the feeling being about steady, with a fair demand from over the cable for small lots, but on account of the scarcity of ocean freight space exporters were not in a position to accept many of the orders.
