Plan Air Service Canada And Portugal



Makes Plea For Maritime Lumber
OTTAWA, April 29 — (CP) — Gordon Isner (L—Halifax) urged today in the Commons that the Maritime Provinces be allowed to export a larger portion of their lumber cuts so as to maintain their overseas markets. He spoke on a section of the Government's main control bill extending wartime regulations on the sale and export of lumber. Mr. Isner said the increased export quota could be allowed without causing any hardship to the domestic market. The Maritimes were not blessed with many industries as were Ontario and Quebec. The Maritimes lived from lumbering, farming and fishing and they needed the overseas markets. Because of the heavy building program going on at home, he realized that all the lumber produced in the Maritimes could not be earmarked for export. Still he believed there was enough lumber available to permit an increase in the export quota. Mr. Isner said he agreed with A.I. Brooks (PC—Royal) that an increase in the retail price should be allowed to discourage black market operations and to make it possible for lumber yards to operate without a loss.
