GLACE BAY IN A SOBBY PLIGHT

GLACE BAY, Dec. 2.—Wednesday's storm was one of the severest ever felt in this locality. No serious damage is reported in the vicinity.

Owing to the failure of the D. C. Co's pumpman to make his appearance for the night shift, the town, which is now getting its supply from the Company while their main line extension to Sand Lake is being completed, was left in total darkness, their being no water for domestic use or for the electric light station. Fortunately no fire alarms came in. Late at night the town secured a man to run the pumps.

About two o'clock this morning the walls of the Engine House of the C. B. C. I. & R. Co. at Broughton, which has not been roofed, collapsed. Engineer Christopher McKelgan was buried beneath the brick, having a leg broken and sustaining serious injuries about the head. His condition is considered serious.

HALF A MILLION LOAN.
