### VISIT OF PRESIDENT HAYES IS DEFENDED.

OTTAWA, June 20.—The Minister of Public Works has received word from President Charles M. Hays of the Grand Trunk Pacific, that, as he has been unexpectedly called to British Columbia, he will not be able to visit St. John as early as he anticipated, but will go there upon his return from the west, in the course of a few weeks.

Mr. Hays will meet E. J. Chamberlain, general manager of the G. T. P., at Winnipeg, and will proceed from there to the coast. This variation of his program was unforeseen, but he will soon go to St. John to inspect the site for the terminals of his company at Courtenay Bay.

### G. T. R. PROPOSAL NOT FAVOURED.

BOSTON, June 20.—Revised reports that the Grand Trunk seeks entry to Boston are not given credence in financial circles.

Regarding the road's application to enter Providence, the Boston News Bureau, a leading financial publication, says:

"Financial circles have not accepted the offer of the Grand Trunk to establish a tide connection via Providence, as a purely philanthropic move designed to stimulate the export business of New England seaports."

"It has been admitted for some time that there has been something behind the scenes which led to the offer. The proposition to build in to Providence focuses on the Grand Trunk's 70 per cent ownership of the stock of Central Vermont."

"It seems a trifle singular that the suggestion has not been advanced."

### THE NAVAL COLLEGE IN HALIFAX, N. S.

HALIFAX, N. S., June 21.—Admiral Kingsmill is in Halifax in connection with dockyard arrangements here for naval and marine and fisheries requirements. He finds that there is ample room in the dockyard for both purposes, the marine and fisheries taking the southern portion and the naval department the northern. The old naval department will be used for the cadets' college.

The admiral says the N.C. will be turned over to the Canadian Government on July 24, and in ten days thereafter will be ready to sail for Halifax.

### STRENUOUS LIFE FOR ROOSEVELT.

NEW YORK, June 20.—Theodore Roosevelt began today the life he has chosen for himself as a private citizen. He has his own ideas of what the country shall do with its ex-president, and after a single day of rest at Sagamore Hill, took up his work today as a contributing editor of the Outlook. Not even the fact that his son was to be married this afternoon detained him from his desk.

The dispatch boat Dolphin, on which Mr. Roosevelt left Oyster Bay last night with Secretary Meyer, of the navy department as his host, brought him into New York early this morning. He went directly to his office and immediately plunged into the mountain of correspondence which has been accumulating for him. Two hours later he appeared on the street and was immediately recognized by the crowds. Before he had walked a block westward toward Fifth avenue he was followed by a throng that blocked the sidewalk.

### MEXICAN UPRISING QUELLED.

CANANEA, Mex., June 20.—The premature discovery of smuggled arms and ammunition followed by the arrest of leaders of the discontented faction and the proclamation of martial law in Cananea and other border towns, probably has checked and discouraged a serious outbreak against the Mexican government, scheduled to take place on June 26, election day.

The revolutionary movement originated among young men in northern Mexico, following, it is said, of General Bernardo Reyes, now in Europe, and of Ctor Madero, candidate for president, now under arrest in Monterey on the charge of causing crowds to form. The discontented faction demands political liberty, free speech and the right to vote. They announce that they will go to the polls on election day prepared to fight if denied their constitutional rights.
