**TEACHER'S MEETING.**—A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Provincial Teachers Association was held in the office of the Charlottetown School Board on Saturday. Every member was present. It was decided to hold the next annual convention of the Association on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of Exhibition week, and arrangements were made to provide an unusually attractive program for that occasion. The following resolution was unanimously adopted: "The Executive Committee of the Provincial Teachers Association desires to place upon record its appreciation of what the Government has done and proposed to do for the promotion of education and the better payment of teachers."

**DEATH OF MR. H. WOOD.**—There has departed from this life another universally respected and esteemed citizen of Charlottetown in the person of the late Mr. Henry Wood. He has resided in this city for three years having previously been a large farmer and meat dealer living in Pownal for a number of years and was well known and beloved by all. ## POULTRY MEETING AT GRAND RIVER.

Thursday, April 17th, the Dominion Government poultry expert gave his first lecture in Grand River, Lot 14. It is to be regretted that many at a distance were prevented from attending by the very bad roads and the very stormy evening. Still, well over one hundred heard the mud and weather to hear Mr. Benson. He dealt in the first part of his discourse with poultry and egg production and in the last half with the cooperative marketing of the products. Mr. Benson's practical experience together with a long and thorough training in both of these departments of the poultry industry in Ontario gives great weight to all he says. He started out by showing the great demand existing at the present time even in Canada for poultry products; our net importation of eggs last year amounted to nearly \$2,300,000. There is an ever increasing demand for eggs of guaranteed quality and freshness. The breed and type of hen must be determined by the consumers demand and the conditions under which she has to live. Any of the general utility breeds suit the needs of this province but it is highly desirable that our community settle upon one breed, for example, Barred Rocks, Rhode Island Reds, &c. From the point of view of high egg production too much attention cannot be given to the breeding and rearing of flocks of healthy, strong birds, full of vigour and hustle. One's success in the poultry business will be directly proportional to the stamina of the birds kept, and this in turn has its origin away back in the hatched egg. To lay the foundation for a good flock of layers, we must feed and breed the parent stock in a scientific way, so that they may lay eggs which will produce viable chicks. The lecture dealt in detail with the feeding of young chicks, the housing and care of poultry, and the preparation of the products for the market. He strongly urged upon the meeting, the considerations of the benefits to be derived from co-operative sale of eggs and poultry.

Organized efforts along this line would bring a double gain, the consumers would be sure of a reliable article, the producer would be stimulated to greater production and would follow more economical methods, and at the same time both would reap a financial gain, by reason of the elimination of the cost of the unnecessary middle man. Professor Cameron who was present also urged the meeting to take up the co-operative sale of eggs and after some discussion it was unanimously agreed that an egg circle be formed. Mr. Benson will return at his earliest convenience to launch the scheme. The following night the lecturer spoke in Thanksgiving hall in Wellington, to a large gathering of farmers. A motion to start an egg circle here was also carried without a dissenting voice.
