whole staff knelt in prayer and since that day there has never been a reverse—the Allies have gone on to victory in Mesopotamia, Palestine, the Balkans, Italy, France, Belgium; may we not therefore claim that the Lord hath done great things for us. America too had her day of prayer on May 30th not kept as it should have been, doubtless but it was a national day of intercession. They only hoped to stand off defeat till next year. They knew their nation could not get to Europe in time to turn the scale for this summer's offensive, but they did. They dared not hope that the allies could push back the enemy on all fronts, but they did until one after another their foes were defeated and sued for peace.

The President called them to prayer—God heard the nation at prayer, and the impossible happened, and America has had her answer to the great national intercession of the 30th of May.

But in our thanksgiving for victory we must not cease our prayers. Those in authority need the guidance of the Holy Ghost in settling the conditions of a just peace, and in dealing with the serious problems connected with demobilization, capital and labor, Ireland, the food and fuel situations, and let us lift our eyes to a nobler vision the victory over sin and Satan, a world redeemed from the curse of lust and drink—a new heaven and a new earth wherein dwelleth righteousness.

UNITED SERVICE

A vast congregation packed the spacious Methodist Church for the United service held under the auspices of the Charlottetown Ministerial Association and hundreds failed to gain admission. On the platform were Rev. C. R. Freeman presiding, Revs. O. B. Emery, R. G. Fulton, Dr. T. F. Fullerton, Field, Mingie, and J. D. McKenzie. There was a massed choir (under Miss Katie Stanley) from the city churches, and the praise was rendered with great volume and heartiness. The Mayor and city council were present, and the detachment of soldiers at the armouries who marched to church headed by the Fourth Regiment Band. The programme was as follows.

Psalm 126.4.

There can only be one theme to occupy our thoughts today—heartfelt thankfulness. Four months ago the most sanguine of those who were in authority never thought that peace could come in such a short time. Even our successes in July and August were feared by many to be only temporary, like many others during the past three years.

How did it happen? Some will say, unity of command; some the doggedness of our men—but may we not claim it as an answer to our prayers?

True many of us have been praying since the war began, true, days have been set apart for prayer by different authorities, but last August 4th was the first really official day of prayer of the British nation, and for the first time for many years the King, the lords and the Commons went to the throne of God officially to pray for the success of our armies.

When the orders were given out at headquarters for the great British offensive in July, an Anglican Bishop who was present suggested to Sir Douglas Haig a most unprecedented thing—that just at that very busy moment that G. H. Q. work should be stopped, and that all present should ask for the Divine blessing and guidance on what was about to be undertaken. This was done. The
