The directors of the Charlottetown Driving Park in addition to increasing the purse in the Free-for-all class from \$250 to \$300 already noticed in our columns have also decided to change a 2.26 class to a 2.25 class.

The prosecution preferred by George W. Gardiner against John Finnegan for maliciously injuring his property was adjourned until Thursday to enable the parties to produce further evidence.

**EASTERN NOTES.**—Weather still wet, and outlook for wheat not good. Oats and potatoes look well so far, the bug did not do as much damage as in former years, the cold wet weather being unfavorable to his migratory habits, and likewise probably seriously interfering with the hatching of his numerous posterity.—There were none landed by the sea this year, in striking contrast with a few years ago, when millions landed on our coasts here, left by the tide on the beach, dried their wings in the sun and started inland in quest of the doomed potato patch.—A few have begun having between the showers, the crop will hardly be an average one.—Very few mackerel have been taken since the first rush, and the fishermen don't consider the prospects very bright for a large catch this season. In fact, there is not the body in the Gulf that they at one time supposed. A fine body of hake of good quality still fills the waters on the southern side of the point, and nothing prevents an immense catch but the scarcity of bait. Some squid have been taken but they are uncerain, these with perch and a few small mackerel netted and jigged, and a few netted herring are the sole dependence of the fishermen for bait; and when he can get enough of these, fish's perch, the hake don't let him be sure of his dory load of fish quite close to the shore.—The cheese factory of East Point is still doing well, and the settlements contributing milk are well satisfied with the results, and fast falling into line with the new order of things.
