WILL CONTROL WIRELESS WAY

Imperial Government Asks Canada to Take Charge of Marconi System

OTTAWA, Nov. 6. The Imperial authorities are bringing wireless telegraphy under the Government control because in time of war it is manifestly desirable that the wireless communication should be under the same supervision as the mails and telegraphy. A suggestion has been received from the British Government that Canada should do likewise. It is understood, therefore that measures will be taken in this country to control wireless telegraphy. There is a clause in the Marconi charter which gives the right to the Government to appropriate in the course of time, and it is understood that no additional charters will be granted. In time of war the Government could at present have sufficient control over the Marconi charter so that it is not likely any immediate steps will be taken to buy out the system.
