YIELDS 316.25 BUSHEL—Mr. W. H. McGregor, of Central, Lot 16 P. E. I., has received from the Experimental Farm at Kentville, N. S., official notification that of the certified seed potatoes grown there last year the Cobblers obtained from him easily headed the list, with the following remarkable showing. They yielded 316.25 bushels per acre, of which 303.05 bushels were marketable and only 13.20 unmarketable. They were grown and tested at the Kentville station under identical conditions to the other four strains grown there in 1923. Two strains of Green Mountain were grown. Seed obtained from the P. E. I. growers yielded 268 bushels per acre, of which 259.8 were marketable. The other strain grown was Bliss Triumph, obtained from a New Brunswick grower, which yielded 229.5 marketable bushels per acre.
