YESTERDAY a GUARDIAN Reporter was shown a beautiful roll top desk presented to Rev. J. W. McConnell, pastor of Grace church, by his many friends at Vernon River and Cherry Valley at the time of his coming to Charlottetown. It was imported direct from the Fred. Macey Co. of Grand Rapids, Mich., and is built of the finest grade of quarter sawed white oak, finished with golden oak piano polish. An artistic arrangement of raised panels of splendid grain effect together with a pigeon hole case hand-somely fitted up containing among other things ten oak front file boxes and several drawers give to it a richness of design not often found in desks of this kind. Mr. McConnell is highly pleased with the gift of the people of his old charge and at so handsome a desk will doubtless be able to turn out some good work for the people among whom he is now labouring.

VICTORIA BRIDGE.—The sleepy little village of Victoria and vicinity now present a lively scene to the passer by, and the hearts of its inhabitants are bounding with pride as they daily view the busy scene presented to their sight, and all their past anticipations, and hopes and grumblings, and fears, and we might also add, their maledictions are forgotten. Work has at last begun on the New Victoria Bridge and from morning till night nothing but the beat of the hammer and the puffing of the engine can be heard. It will be remembered that this bridge was destroyed last fall, by a high wind and tide and that ever since a great extent of country has been shut off from a shipping port; and consequently the people have been put to a great deal of inconvenience. This bridge was originally altogether a brush and pile bridge and its position at the mouth of the Westmoreland River, together with the great current of water that is always sweeping through it, rendered it very difficult to keep in repair; in fact, this bridge was, at its best, a very uncertain construction, and at times really unsafe. The new bridge, however, will be much more substantial and, moreover, will mark a new era in the bridge-building history of Prince Edward Island. The main feature of the bridge is, the steel span of 100 feet in length supported at either end by 10 pitched-pile piles (crossed) and each weighing some 2,400 lbs. The remainder will be an ordinary brush affair and this contract has been given Mr. N. Pembroke, Victoria. Mr. Forbe, of Halifax, is overseeing the construction of the steel part, but as yet no one has been appointed to oversee the other part of the work, but it is to be hoped that this oversight will be soon attended to. Although the work has been delayed so long, it is hoped that the bridge will be completed in a few months and the people will be rewarded by a substantial affair and not by such a tottering unsafe bridge as its predecessor.
