MANY friends on P. E. Island though regretting his departure will be pleased to learn that Professor J. W. Mitchell, B. A., for the past two years superintendent of Maritime creameries with headquarters at Truro, who instructed the Dairy School here last winter and last August address-farmers' meetings through the Island has been appointed to the management of the newly-created City Dairy Company, Kingston, Ont. Mr. Mitchell leaves the Maritime service with the good will of all with whom he had come in contact and with the highest appreciation of the Commissioner as well. It is a good omen when private corporations are able to secure the services of government employees, and is at the same time a reminder to those in authority that conditions today render the cost of living considerably greater than was the case when some positions were created. It is thought improbable, in view of the fact that Nova Scotia now employs an inspector for the province, that a Dominion official will again be appointed. Mr. Mitchell leaves for a visit to similar institutions in the United States before assuming his duties in December.
