ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

PETER McDONALD, a native of Surrey P. E. I. was drowned recently from the schooner Theodore Roosevelt while out fishing off Boston.

Mrs Devona McKenzie, who has been visiting friends in Cape Breton and different parts of Nova Scotia has returned to her home in North Cardigan. Her many friends are pleased to see her home again.

A HALIFAX despatch says:—"The three commercial travellers charged with causing a fire at the Queen Hotel were discharged at the police court this morning, there being no prosecutor. It appears the whole business was the result of a practical joke."

LIEUT. RICHARDS and SERGT. PROUDFOOT of the 78th. Regiment, N. S. and SERGT. COOK and CORP. McLEAN of the A. M. S. Charlottetown, have joined the R. C. R. for a course in signalling under Capt. Lister. The Captain gives his class daily practice on the barracks square, and they seem to be making good progress.—Fredericton Herald.

PRESIDENT Trotter of Acadia writes to the Messenger and Visitor that it is now morally certain that fifty thousand dollars will be raised for forward movement in sums of \$300 to \$5,000. This is subscribed by sixty persons. It was hoped that \$60,000 would be raised on this plan. Dr. Trotter now proposes to ask for sums appealing generally to the rank and file. He hopes to obtain \$15,000 from this second coup.

Richard F. Jamieson, of the Experimental farm Ottawa and formerly of Sturgeon P. E. I., who has been sued for breach of promise by Miss Isabella Donnelly, of Boston, formerly of Ottawa, claims that he has a strong case and says he will defend the action in the courts. He states that his engagement with plaintiff was broken off with her consent, before he contracted marriage with his present wife. The letters which are cited by plaintiff as proof of his engagement to her, were, says Jamieson, written some time before the engagement was declared off by mutual consent.

THE Times had a pleasant call yesterday from T. A. McLean, a well known contractor of Charlottetown, of the Maritime Contracting & Mining Co., Ltd. Mr. McLean has been in Springhill looking after the work his company has in hand there in connection with the putting in of a water system. The Maritime Contracting & Mining Co., has the contract for constructing the Springhill water works and during the winter the pipe has been distributed along the line from the town to the source of the water supply. The reservoir will be built on the summit of Cobscook Mountain, about seven miles from Springhill. About 1400 tons of pipe have been distributed for the main and the work of constructing a dam and excavating for the pipe line will be commenced this spring. The Springhill water system will cost in the vicinity of \$100,000. Mr. McLean's company is also putting in the Shediac water system which was commenced last fall and which was about half completed before work was suspended for the winter. Work on the Shediac water works will be continued about May 1st. The Maritime Contracting & Mining Co., Ltd. is also figuring on a water system for Dalhousie, and a son of Mr. McLean is now in Dalhousie preparing estimates as to the probable cost of the work. Mr. McLean, although being a very busy man with his contracts, takes an active interest in the political affairs of his province. He is a staunch Conservative and has been chosen a standard bearer for his party in the past two general provincial elections. Mr. McLean first ran against Premier Peters in 1897, reducing the grit majority from 400 to 200, and in 1900 he ran against Mr. Palmer, who recently resigned his seat in the third district of Queens for violation of the independence of parliament act, and further reduced the liberal majority to 43. Mr. McLean will doubtless be the choice of the party in the by-election, if one should be held, and he is almost sure, judging by the way P. E. I. elections are going just now, of defeating the liberal nominee, whether it be Mr. Palmer or some one else. Speaking of the prospects of the Conservative party in the Island province, Mr. McLean says they are very bright. Public feeling is running strongly against the liberals, both in Ottawa and in the local legislature and when the opportunity presents itself, there is little doubt but the Conservatives will sweep the Island. Mr. McLean crosses to Charlottetown today or tomorrow.—Moncton Times.
