EFFECTIVE INDEPENDENCE.

The Patriot in one of its peculiar wobbling articles on Saturday assailed The Guardian, the independent press and the independent members of Parliament, if such there be. This was to be expected. The dominant idea of the party leader and the party newspaper organ which supports him is that the party must be supported and commended right or wrong. There are those who think differently. They say still have strong party preferences, but will not support the party of their preference when in a wrong. It so happens that for some months past from the beginning of the winter navigation, the business of ordering our winter mail, passenger and freight service has been bungled and mismanaged in a manner that contrasts unfavorably with our worst experiences in the past. The Guardian in a spirit of charity to our representatives laid the blame largely upon the party system, where it no doubt in part belongs.

For this partial defence of our representatives we have again incurred the angry censure of the Liberal organ, which is a matter of entire indifference on our part, and at the same time is but a poor service to the men whom The Patriot supports. For if the party system is in no way to blame, the men must personally bear the odium of the existing order of things.

which has become intolerable. To the great mind of The Patriot the Government is all right, our representatives have done their utmost, and should go on rendering a thick and thin support, utterly regardless of whether we get our mails once a day or once a month, or whether the Government Railway trains connect with the Government steamers or not. The fault, according to The Patriot, lies with certain fossil officials and red tape. What are we to think of a Government that cannot control its own servants? Or what are we to think of a Government that will not heed the counsels of the people's representatives? Or, if the present conditions are the result of our representatives' advice, what are we to think of their wisdom?

Even The Patriot is compelled to admit that matters are about in the worst possible condition so far as our winter service is concerned. And yet no one of our representatives (all of whom have free passes in their pockets) has thought it worth while to go to Ottawa and straighten matters out. So things have gone on till mid-winter, with the people talking of indignation meetings and effigy burning, while our representatives have contented themselves with sending an occasional telegram (at the public expense) to Ministers who apparently neither know nor care whether the Island is sunk in the sea or still above water. This may be strong language, but the history of the season's winter service justifies it. One energetic, business-like, independent representative could have gone to Ottawa, and brought order out of chaos. But instead of independence we have party subservency and whispering humbleness, instead of energetic attention to the public interest we have supineness and neglect.

The Ministers are, unfortunately quite as sure of the support of certain of our representatives, if our communications were entirely cut off as if they were regularly maintained. Why should the Ministers care? Hide-bound party-ism rules the roost and the party organ must needs place the blame anywhere but where it belongs. We say the party system is in part at fault. That is no doubt a charitable view and still the party organ rejects it. We see no other way of accounting for the deplorable condition of the winter service unless by charging gross neglect or utter incompetence. The Patriot may make its choice between the two.

SPLENDID PROGRESS.

The 71st annual report of the bank of Nova Scotia which was published in The Guardian of Saturday shows that strong institution has had another successful year. The net profits for the past year were \$492,322—an increase of \$61,395 as compared with 1901. There was transferred to the reserve fund \$200,000 making the reserve now \$3,000,000, equal to 150 per cent of capital. A comparison with the annual statement for 1893 will show the splendid strides made by the Bank of Nova Scotia. During the six year period capital has been increased from \$1,500,000 to \$2,000,000 and the reserve has been doubled. In 1896 the deposits were \$6,541,202; now the deposits total \$19,532,283, an increase of \$12,991,078. The notes in circulation have increased from \$1,323,141 in 1896 to \$1,903,834 in 1902.

A dividend at the rate of ten per cent amounting to \$100,000 will be payable on February 2nd. The Bank of Nova Scotia has now 46 branches in Canada, Newfoundland, United States and West Indies.
